Day of Caring for Breast Cancer Awareness

This event will be held on Saturday, May 8th, at the Merchandise Mart, from 8am to 3pm. Its purpose is to provide education, empowerment, and hope to all women and men interested in this disease. There will be seminars, exhibits, a silent auction and boutique, and a luncheon/fashion show. Over 1000 people are expected to attend.

Day of Caring was a service grant recipient of our club this year, and we are one of their key sponsors. With our money, a resource center, Sense of Security, will be set up to provide non-medical financial assistance to breast cancer patients in Colorado. Some of the resource tables in the center will include the Food Stamp Program, the Low-income Energy Assistance Program (LEAP), and the Consumer Credit Counseling Service.

By helping to fund this organization, the Zonta Club of Denver will receive name recognition on all conference materials, a half-page ad in the conference program, signage in the resource center, the ability to distribute give-aways in the conference take-home bags, and ten free conference registrations.

Volunteers are needed for the resource centers and many other areas including the registration tables and the silent auction. Volunteers will not need to pay the registration fee, and will be able to attend seminars, etc. if time permits. If at all possible, please volunteer for all or part of the day. This will be an excellent opportunity to support one of our service grant organizations, and to help our club gain the publicity we are striving for. 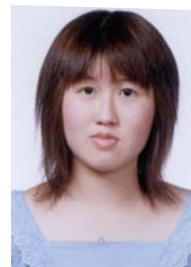

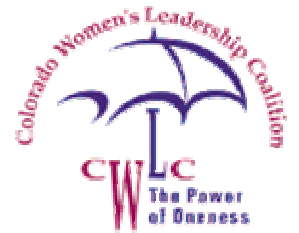

TAKE ACTION FOR FAIR PAY ON EQUAL PAY DAY, 2004! The average woman working full-time, year-round, still earns just 77¢ for every \$1.00 earned by the average man, according to the most recent statistics from the U. S. Census Bureau and the U. S. Bureau of Labor Statistics (based on 2002 annual earnings released in 2003). Women of color fare even worse, with African American women making 68¢ on the dollar compared to the highest earners (white men), and Latinas making only 56¢. Men of color also experience wage disparities. The ratio for African American men is 75¢, and 64¢ for Latinos. Hundreds of organizations nationwide, including 9to5 Colorado, Colorado Women's Chamber of Commerce, Colorado Business and Professional Women, Denver Women's Commission and Colorado Women's Agenda here in Colorado, will observe Equal Pay Day on Tuesday, April 20. Tuesday symbolizes the day when women's wages catch up to men's wages from the previous week. In other words, because women earn less, on average, they must work nearly seven days to earn what the average man would earn in only five.
