

Also, lots of thanks to Mindy Craig who brought this particular film concept to our committee and coordinated the attendance of Allison Shigo, the producer of A Walk to Beautiful, and to Krystie Rose for her participation in covering ground for the publicity and flyers. We are also thankful for the many ZCD members who assisted us in setting up the reception room, attending to the guests, helping with clean-up and those who bought and sold tickets to friends and family.

Service Committee

The Service Committee will be meeting in April - the date will be announced at the meeting. We met at the Mariposa House, the recipient of one of our service grants for this year. Their needs are many, but seem to fall into two main areas:

- 1. The women come to the house with very low self esteem and many health issues. They could use assistance and mentoring in areas from budgeting and finances to self care like teaching them good nutrition, exercise, and possibly yoga or tai chi, or just walking. It was suggested that a group membership could be obtained for the Botanic Gardens. It would be a safe place for them to get exercise.
- 2. Needs for the house. They need furniture for the entry area a love seat and possible table and lamp. Colorful decor is also a needed curtains, cheerful pictures, and dishes. The kitchen cabinet collapsed recently, and they have a need for plates, bowls, and salad plates. The remodeled kitchen is well stocked, and they do not currently have a need for us to cook meals the women do a good job of cooking for themselves, but could fix healthier meals.

One suggestion was that groups might want to "Adopt a Bedroom" to provide colorful bedding, curtains, etc. They also need patio furniture. There is space on the side of the house for a garden, and several women have expressed an interest in planting some flowers and vegetables. The manager indicated they could arrange for the ground to be roto tilled and some top soil brought in, if our members would help the ladies with planning and planting a garden.

As you can see, their needs are great. We'll have more on how Zonta might serve soon.

Our only active project in March was Dolores Project, where dinner was served to almost 40 women on March 15.

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February 2009 Dinner Meeting Doubletree Hotel Denver 2/12/09

President Judy McNerny called the meeting to order at 6:05 p.m. and **Liz Cameron** read the inspirational Glory Forever

Kendis Paris, a guest of **Kathy Hyzer**, was introduced as was **Sue Krueger**, guest of Beth Mundell.

Kendis was one of the organizers of the Human Trafficking Awareness Conference last fall. She presented an update of her efforts on trafficking as the Status of Women Moment. President Judy McNerny asked for and received approval of the January minutes as published in the *Smoke Signal*.

Barbara Pellegren was not able to attend so there wasn't a finance report.

Joetta Williams reported for Membership. The committee is still working on a permanent location for the monthly dinner meeting. So this month we are trying the Doubletree Hotel Denver and stay tuned for information on the location of the March meeting.

Beth Mundell reported the Delores Project this Sunday is the only on-going service project at the present time.

Wendy Moraskie indicated she is gearing up for the film event by updating brochures, making a new service project banner, etc. The website is updated and is to be remodeled. We will have a presentation at the Women's Legislative Breakfast next week.

Mindy Craig reported for the Fundraising Committee. She talked about how important it will be for all members to participate to make this the success we need it to be. Flyers were available for members to take and post in libraries, grocery stores, fitness centers, etc., any place in the community where people might see them. Mindy suggested giving promotional brochures to friends – send e-mails – meet friends for a pre-event meal and then head over to the film, etc. She also suggested if a member isn't available to attend she can donate money so a Metro student can attend. She indicated we need to get the word out to everyone including other Zonta Clubs. And this event will get the word out about our organization, too. March 8th happens to be International Women's Day and Zonta Rose Day which all tie into the film "A Walk to Beautiful".

Nikki Headlee asked that suggestions for new club officers be submitted to the Nominating Committee by next Monday.

Krystie Rose Millich received the Zonta Rock last month and passed it on to Mindy Craig for all her great work on the film event.

Kathy Hyzer brought the door prize and Gayle Erickson-Ash was the winner.

This meeting like every February dinner meeting is a special occasion as we present checks to organizations to support specific projects. The selection process is performed by the Service Committee. Kathy Hyzer and Beth Mundell, co-chairs of the committee explained the distribution of funds for this year. Beth told of the decision to give 2 larger awards rather than a number of smaller ones as in the past.

Before announcing the 2 recipients, though, Rachel Lewis, Volunteer Coordinator for Denver Kids, Inc was introduced. Zonta was one of the founders of Denver Girls, the predecessor to Denver Kids, and has a long history of supporting this organization. Rachel was given a check for \$5,000. a bequest from Bobbie Razee, a long time Zontian who recently passed away.

Carol Lease of the Empowerment Program accepted a check for \$10,000 of which part was proceeds from Essie Garrett's walk to Kansas. The Empowerment Program is 23 years old and has a 33 person staff. In 2008 they served 28% more women (average age – 38 years old) than the previous year. Their mission is to provide education, employment assistance, health, housing referrals and support services to women who are in disadvantaged positions due to incarceration, poverty, homelessness, HIV/AIDS infection or involvement in the criminal justice system. Their goal is to decrease rates of recidivism by providing case management, support services, basic skills education, housing and resource coordination that can offer viable alternatives to habits and choices that may lead to criminal behaviors.

A. J. Steele and Amanda Finger represented the Polaris Project and accepted our check in the amount of \$20,000. The vision of the Polaris Project is for a world without slavery. It is one of the largest anti-trafficking organizations in the U.S. Our financial support will be used for research; a two-phase community needs assessment to gauge services available statewide to assist victims of trafficking.

The closing quote was presented by Judy McNerny.

One hundred two tickets needed to be sold to break even and a hundred twenty-something were sold. Final numbers aren't available yet as the event was held just last Sunday. Nikki gave a brief history of fundraising events and encouraged us to take it to three years. Bo Smith of the Denver Film Society wants to partner on more events.

Beth Mundell passed the Service Projects book around the room so volunteers could sign up for the Delores Project dinners and Excelsior and WOW's fundraisers.

Wendy Moraskie brought the updated club brochures for members to take. She talked about how fundraising relates to the club mission. She, also, talked about how hard it is to get media coverage for these events. She sent media info to 30 outlets for the film event and got no responses. She asked if anybody has any connections to please let her know.

Sheila gave an update on the district conference we are hosting over the Halloween weekend this year. The Red Lion Hotel Denver is the location. Four Z-Bees are traveling to Lamar next week to promote it at the Area 4 meeting. The next week will be another appearance, this time at the Area 3 meeting. Sheila also discussed the past governor's lunches she has been organizing. The first one was held to interview Mary Benoit. The purpose of gathering for these lunches is to discuss what did and what didn't work at district confer-
