LETTER FROM DISTRICT 26 GOVERNOR



First of all, let us express our heartfelt gratitude for the kind words given us from all over the world after the recent misfortune that hit Japan. Over 100 countries have extended their helping hands to Japan in various fields including medical aid, searches for the survivors, and professional advices on nuclear matters.

It has been two weeks since the occurrence of the disaster and many cities, towns and villages have been suffering with lack of supplies – food, oil, water, gas and electricity. The region seriously damaged is situated in the northeastern part of Japan where the temperature can be as low as several degrees below zero centigrade. The situation is being gradually alleviated, but of course not to a full extent. Many people are forced to stay in the evacuation points with minimal heating facilities.

However, I am pleased to inform you that all Zontians in the damaged areas survived and are active in the aid of their neighbors. They are the members of Sendai, Shiogama, Morioka, Kouriyama and Fukushima Zonta Clubs.

To assist District 26 support those affected by the earthquake, I request that concerned individuals follow the advice below, as determined by the District 26 Board and informed by the ZI Emergency and Disaster Funds Policy which provides clear guidelines in these circumstances. The policy requires any donations to be made as individuals rather than Zontians.

A special fund has been created to be administered by the District, which will be directed to the areas in Japan affected by these disasters, specifically three prefectures - Miyagi, Fukushima and Iwate. This fund is called the 2011 Tohoku Pacific Earthquake Relief Fund Zonta D26. The donated funds will be distributed and directed to help women and children in the areas seriously damaged. A special committee of the District will determine who receives the money from the fund and detailed reports will be

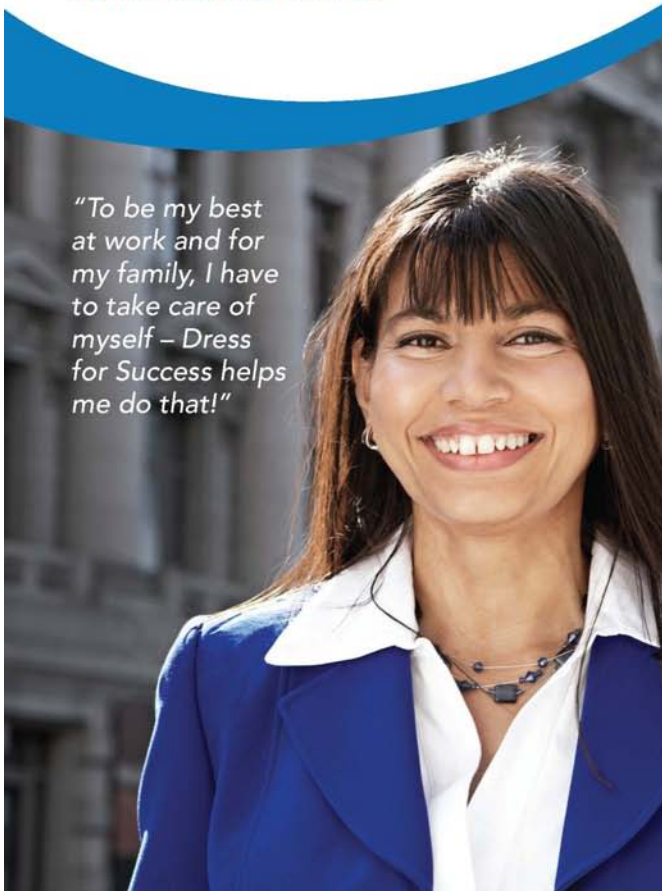

Dear Kathy and Members of the Zonta Denver Club:

It is with heartfelt gratitude that we acknowledge your recent gift to the Mental Health Center of Denver's GROW program in the amount of \$14,000 (check #1186 dated 2-10-11). You can be sure that this gift will make a significant difference in the lives of the women served by this exciting program.

The Mental Health Center of Denver continues to reach out into the community to serve more people needing services for a mental illness. Although we have doubled the number of people served in the past five years, we still find that we must turn away two people needing our help for every one that we are able to take into a treatment program.

That is one of the reasons we have recently purchased the property at 4455 E. 12th Ave. in Denver from the University of Colorado Health Sciences Center (prior to that it was Mt. Airy Psychiatric Hospital). We are soon beginning a complete remodel of that building with plans to open it in July of 2012. At that time, we will consolidate our four adult clinic sites into the one location. This will allow us to serve even more people in coming years.

The GROW Program is one that will move into that space. The new space will be very consumer-friendly and will offer state-of-the-art facilities for both staff and consumers.

I'm enclosing a copy of our latest newsletter which introduces the new building and our new Annual Report which will be "officially" distributed at our Annual Meeting this week.

Both of these will tell you more about our accomplishments and also our plans for a "Bold Future." Your support of our GROW Program is an important part of building that future and we cannot thank you enough.
