WOMEN WORLD LEADERS



German Chancellor Angela Merkel and U.K. Prime Minister Theresa May



Whether you like or dislike Hillary and her politics, the fact is that she is the first woman to be nominated as the presidential candidate of a major U.S. political party. History has been made, and another glass ceiling shattered.

The list of countries that have had a woman leader is growing, but is still relatively small. Of 193 nations, there are currently 18 female world leaders (figurehead monarchs are not included). That's about one-in-ten of leaders of UN member states. Nine (half) are the first

women to hold their country's highest office. The number has doubled since 2005. Of 142 nations in a recent study, 63 have had a female head of state since 1964, but in most cases, she was in power or less than 4 of the 50 years. In 11 countries, she led for less than a year.

India, Ireland and Bangladesh have had women leaders for 21 of the past 50 years. Iceland, Finland and Norway are next with 20, 12 and 11 respectively. In Ecuador, and Madagascar, women served for just two days before they were forced out and replaced by men.

A Pew Research Center report found that "Americans believe there aren't more women in top elective office in the U.S. is that they are held to higher standards than men."

Yep, we still have to do all the same things, only backward and in high heels, and we can't act too female, or we'll be called "hysterical," or act too much like men and be labeled "pushy," or "witchy," (pardon my euphemism).
