Handicapped parking is available in the parking structures and also at street level in front of the hotel, accessed from Colo Blvd driving south.

Member Moment—Lydia Scherek presented Julie Bradley to the membership as the Zontian of the Year with a description of her life, travels, careers, goals and aspirations.

Program Jackie Norris, Executive Director of Metro Volunteers!, gave an excellent presentation on her organization whose mission is connecting volunteers and promoting volunteerism. She gave an overview of volunteerism today and put into perspective what it is to recruit and retain volunteers—not unlike recruitment and retention of members in Zonta.
