



It's Wednesday evening here at McMurdo Station, which is located on Ross I sland just off the Antarctic Mainland. Thanksgiving Day is tomorrow for us, however, we celebrate it this coming Saturday. This Saturday and Sunday will be my first weekend off since I got here at the beginning of October!

We work 6 days/week for 10 hours/day so it doesn't leave much free time. However, in the free time that I have I attend science & history lectures, take hikes, I'm working on a ceramic seal, learning to tap dance and taking computer classes. Of course, I spend time just hanging out talking. I'm also most excited to tell you that I got an article published in the Antarctic Sun, our local paper. To see a picture of me and read my article go to www.polar.org select the Antarctic Sun and the link to my article. Reading this will give you my overall feelings about this place at this time.

You can also learn a lot about Antarctica at this site. It's a continent covered by an enormous ice sheet and surrounded by frozen ocean. Without the ice it would be about 2.7 million square miles. With the ice sheet it's

about 5.4 million square miles. The US is 3.6 million square miles. IF all the ice melted. the world's oceans would be raised between 160-200 feet!

Science groups are studying the hole in the ozone, weather & climate, ocean circulation, meteorites, radio waves and how the heck fish, seals, penguins don't freeze in the water and on land.



ZONTA CLUB OF DENVER GENERAL MEMBERSHIP MEETING NOVEMBER 13, 2003 MINUTES

President Evie Ashmore called the meeting to order at 6:10 P.M. Twenty - three members were present, as well as eight guests. Julie Bradley gave the invocation. Minnie Lundberg gave a short presentation during member moment concerning our sponsored foster child.

Guests Mike Harris and his wife Liz were introduced. Mike is an investigator with the Jefferson County District Attorney's office specializing in crimes against children. His wife Liz is also an officer and is integral in making arrests. They gave a presentation on crimes committed using the internet, and how offenders were apprehended.

MINUTES - of October 9 general membership meeting were approved as written.

TREASURER'S REPORT – was given by Judy Allen. Judy Allen moved recommend combining raffle account into service account. Motion passed. This will reduce excessive account service charges on the raffle account.

COMMITTEE REPORTS -

<u>Membership</u> – Kathy Hyzer and Cathy Conley briefly discussed our contract with the Marriott, which is due for renewal in November. Kathy is going to try to renegotiate a lower required number of attendees, as our current is technically 30, while 25 has been the accepted norm. The Holiday dinner will be at Landry's on December 11.

<u>Service Committee</u> – report was given by Sheila Davis. Race for the Cure on October 12 was a success, with a Zonta team organized by Dare Roseberry from the Zonta II club. Sheila coordinated UNICEF items for sale at the meeting. The club will gather items for "Adopt a Family" at the December meeting. The Gathering Place needs volunteers to serve lunch on Nov 18th and 19th. <u>Fundraising</u> – Diane Twining presented the 2003 proposed fundraising plan. Discussion was held, and positive input was generated. The theatre event is being planned.

<u>Communications Committee</u> – report was given by Julie Bradley. Julie was invited to provide information on our club by the International PR committee. Julie will use our publication designed by Wendy-Henry-Moraskie.

<u>Status of Women Committee</u> – report was given by Linda Rhea. Linda has sent letters regarding the Young Woman in Public Affairs Award. Suggestions for recipients are welcome. Suggestions are also welcome for the Jane Klausmann award, given to a young woman pursuing an undergraduate degree in business. Linda mentioned the upcoming Santa Claus workshop and gave possible work dates.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS – New member reception held November 6 at the King Mansion was a success. Several prospective members resulted. The club wished to thank Minnie Lundberg for the use of a lovely facility.

NEW BUSINESS

Proposed Service Grants - Sheila Davis presented the 2003 Service Grants, and gave a information regarding each proposed recipient. The grants proposed were: Rape Assistance Awareness Program - \$3,000' Salvation Army - Red Shield Starlites - \$6,000; Work Options for Women - \$3,500; Day of Caring for Breast Cancer Awareness - \$5,000; Women's Bean Project - \$1,700; Samaritan Counseling Center - \$5,000; Rocky Mountain Parents as Teachers - \$3,000; for a total of \$27,200.

The \$27,200 represents the bulk of the "local project" portion of the Zonta Denver Service Funds, Inc. account distributions. Denver Kids, foster parents plan, and other represent the other part of local distributions. The local portion accounts for roughly 67% of total Zonta Denver Service Funds, Inc. distributions, while the distributions to Zonta International represents 33%. Sheila moved the club approve the projects listed on the "Proposed Service Grant" spreadsheet handout as listed. Motion passed.

Sheila also discussed the remainder of the Club Service and Raffle Funds, (different accounts than the Zonta Denver Service Funds, Inc.) going to Speaker Fees, Young Woman in Public Affairs, Metro Scholarship, and other. Sheila moved the club approve \$1435 funding from the club and service accounts as listed. Motion passed.

Area 3 Project - "Seeds for Afghanistan" was clarified. Kate Linscott explained seeds need to be from a Colorado source.

ANNOUNCEMENTS

Evie announced there will be no board meetings in November or December. The Holiday party will take place December 11 at Landry's restaurant.

Meeting was adjourned at 8:35 P.M.
