The committee met on November 1 to discuss the goals for the year. The purpose of the Taskforce is to (a) educate ourselves regarding major issues and proposed legislation in 2006-07 that impact primarily women; (b) learn the process whereby ideas become bills and bills become laws; (c) work together to support a few important legislative measures; (d) make concrete goals and follow through.

The committee discussed the support of a CEDAW resolution before the Colorado legislation and researching other women's groups to help us interested in this issue and taking action with us.

Zonta Club of Denver General Meeting Minutes November 9, 2006

President Sheila Davis called the meeting to order at 6:05pm.

Guests: Attending as guests were Area 3 Director Kay Meyer and her daughter Alyson Meyer-Gould, Susan Leibsley, Marcy Kaufman, and Nancy Wong. Nancy is to be inducted soon.

Invocation: Julie Bradley read a passage from <u>Reflections</u> by Sandra Stemmler.

Status of Women Moment: Evie Ashmore spoke about the United Nations Convention on the Elimination of All Forms of Discrimination Against Women (CEDAW).

Member Moment: Dorothy Swindt honored Minnie Lundberg, who is celebrating her 30th anniversary with ZCD. Minnie joined in 1976, and sponsored Dorothy in 1982. She is the treasurer of the Kenneth King Foundation, and is active in her church and the American Legion Auxiliary. Dorothy, Sheila Davis, and Nikki Headlee presented Minnie with a certificate of appreciation and a dozen yellow roses.

Program: Evie Ashmore and Kay Meyer gave the program on CEDAW, which defines and condemns discrimination against women in many areas, including civil, political, economic, social, and cultural. Evie described CEDAW's importance and remarked that the United States is the only industrialized nation that has not yet ratified it.

Minutes: Cathy Conley made a motion to approve the October minutes as printed in the Smoke Signal. Linda Rhea seconded and the motion carried.

Treasurer: Judy Allen noted that the balance in the operating budget is \$9,086.04, with \$5,920.50 in the service account. Money will be moved into the service account in February 2007 to pay for grants.

Membership: Nikki Headlee and Cathy Conley reported that there are currently 38 members. Julie Bradley and her committee are organizing the holiday party to be held December 7th at the Brown Palace. Invitations will be mailed this weekend. Julie asked members to bring a card for Bobbie Razee, who will be honored at the party for 60 tears with ZCD.

Service/Status of Women: Robin Forti circulated sign-up sheets for service opportunities. The new flyer for the Imagination Library has been distributed, and Robin is working on a change of address procedure. Women's Bean Project products can be ordered from Linda Rhea. Thirty percent of sales go to the club. Robin distributed a spreadsheet detailing the Service Committee's grant recommendations. Linda Rhea made a motion to accept the figures under club funds for our service projects this year. Nikki Headlee seconded and the motion passed.

Fundraising: Dottie Jenkins noted that a non-event fundraiser is planned for the year. More than half the Macy's tickets were returned to her. Drawing for the raffle will take place at the Christmas party. Money and unsold tickets should be given to Judy Allen. The committee is planning for 3 theater events, and will put together theme baskets to sell at the Amelia Earhart dinner. The garage sale will be held in late spring at Cynthia Herndon's.

Public Relations: ZCD will host the Area 3 meeting March 31st at Excelsior Youth Center. The committee is working on ways to promote Zonta.

Old Business: Judy Allen presented the budget for '06-'07. She noted that it's substantially the same as last year's, except that all speaker fees will come out of Service, and guest dinners from Membership. Diane Twining made a motion to accept the budget as presented. Evie Ashmore seconded and the motion passed.

New Business: Donna Hultin was voted in as Director and Service/Status of Women co-chair. A copy was distributed of a proposed letter from the club to Secretary of State Condoleeza Rice in support of CEDAW. Judy McNerny made a motion to approve the letter. Cathy Conley seconded, and the motion passed.

- Minnie Lundberg for her 30 years with the club.
 - •Amanda Megill for her role in organizing the Teen Moms cooking class. Robin Forti was also recognized for her work on the class.

Announcement: Judy Allen, Carroll Allen, and Linda Rhea head up the planning for the Area 3 meeting Saturday, March 31st at Excelsior Youth Center. Members are asked to bring a gently used item for the girls.

Julie Bradley won the door prize.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 8:50pm.
