Important Message from the President of Zonta International....

25 November 2008

To All Zonta Club Presidents:

This message is to tell you of an unusual action taken by the Zonta International Board of Directors.

The Zonta International Board has acted, in its capacity as Sole Member of the Zonta International Foundation, to remove some of the individual members from the Zonta International Foundation Board. The Foundation’s Bylaws permit this action.

This extraordinary action was taken in light of a serious disagreement between the Zonta International Board and Foundation Executive Committee over the handling of Foundation’s assets, including:

- the purchase of an “office condominium” **before** selling the current headquarters building;
- choosing office condominium space which, in the opinion of the Zonta International Board, **will not suitably house** Zonta International and Foundation operations and our treasured artifacts;
- taking out a **loan** at 6.5% to cover the condominium purchase, and another loan to cover construction, when Zonta International could have made the loan more economically; and
- **pledging restricted assets** of the Foundation.

The Zonta International Board members will serve as the Zonta International Foundation Board members for the time being, until the Foundation’s financial matters are well in hand and prudent steps are taken to preserve capital and reduce interest payments.

The Zonta International Board believes that, if the Foundation Executive Committee had included it in decisions as they were being made, this extraordinary action would not have been necessary. We heard from some members of the Foundation Executive Committee leadership that they did not need Zonta International’s approval for their actions. This path was leading to dissension within the Zonta family and, in the opinion of the Zonta International Board, leading to a diminishment of resources.

We look forward to moving forward with a strong and united family of Zonta organizations to improve the status of women throughout the world. We thank the members of the former Zonta International Foundation Board for their

past contributions and have invited them to continue furthering the cause of women worldwide through their Zonta membership.

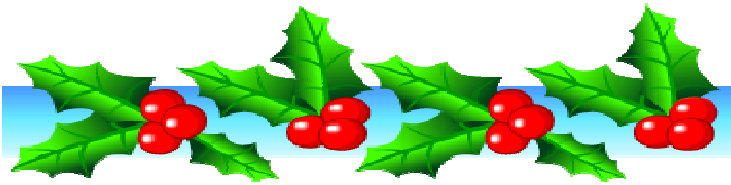

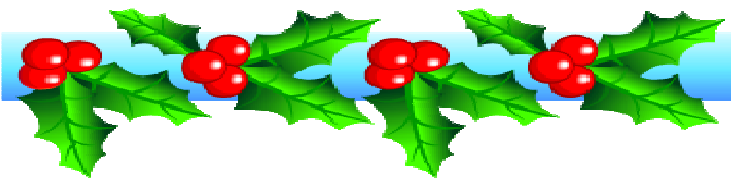

The result of this assessment will be better coordination of services for women and girls who have been rescued from human trafficking.

Just Hang Up! Auto Warranty Scams

Almost everyone has heard it lately. You pick up the phone only to have an automated voice tell you that "Your car warranty is expiring" or you receive a postcard in the mail telling you the same thing. The public is being bombarded with notices via postcard, letter, email, and automated phone calls in an attempt to sell outrageously priced extended auto warranties. This scam is especially dangerous because not only can they collect money for a bogus service, but they can also steal your identity, or both.

Here are some red flags to look out for when being solicited by these companies:

- They try to pressure you into doing it 'on the spot' or 'that day'.
- They avoid or refuse to give you the actual name of the company.
- They call numerous times throughout all hours of the day and night.

A Few Other Tricks To Be Aware Of

- These offers are made to seem urgent with the use of terms such as: "priority level: high", "final notice", or "motor vehicle notification". This scare tactic is used to con the consumer into giving up personal information.
- They also often carry the name of reputable car manufacturers in bold letters which leads the recipients to believe that the sender is somehow linked to the dealer that sold them the car.
- It is also common for these solicitations to be presented to people whose car warranty has already expired or never even purchased one in the first place for their older car.

Always remember: Don't let a high-pressure sales pitch talk you into something you don't want or need. **Just Hang Up!**

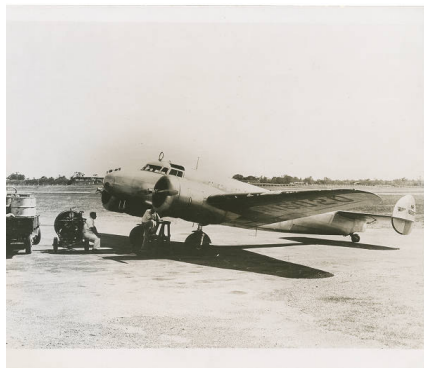

Zonta Club of Denver Monthly Dinner Meeting 11/13/08

President Judy McNerny called the meeting to order at 6:05 pm

Liz Cameron read 2 poems for the Inspirational Moment followed by the introduction of guests Julie Schmidt, Vincie Logan, Deborah Bruner, Alice Borodkin and Ava Chappel.

Kathy Hyzer, Service Co-Chair, passed out a chart showing the distribution of service dollars. She mentioned that the allocations are a bit different this year. She explained that most of our usual recipients aren't eligible for a grant this year so it was decided to give two larger grants this time. Hopefully, this will result in making a bigger impact, too. The Polaris Project whose mission is to combat human trafficking and modern-day slavery will receive \$20,000. And The Empowerment Program – Chrysalis Project – will be awarded \$10,000. The goal of the Chrysalis Project is to improve the lives of women who are and have been involved in street level prostitution who want to “leave the life” by receiving drug treatment, mental health and trauma treatment, training and employment services and comprehensive case management services. The Club will honor our commitment to the Imagination Library for the remainder of the year and then that will be the end of our involvement. Anyone wanting to participate in this project can do so through the Boulder Club. Kathy passed sign-up sheets for the Salvation Army bell-ringing at Macy's, the Santa Claus Shop and Delores Project dinners for December and January.

Judy asked for and received approval for the October minutes as published.

As **Barbara Pellegren** is attending to her husband following surgery, there wasn't a financial report.

Joetta Williams, Membership Co-Chair, explained Jacki Sammons' home is the location for the annual holiday party on the usual meeting night of December 11th at 5:30. The beneficiaries of this event will be the 26 women of the Women's Bean Project. The Club will furnish ham and wine. A sheet was passed for members to sign up for sides and desserts. Joetta said the committee is, also, looking at other locations for the monthly meeting.

Deb Heckart, Fundraising Co-Chair, reported there wasn't a committee meeting this month so there isn't anything new to report.

Diane Twining talked about one of our favorite Zontians who is our Zontian of the Year – Minnie Lundberg. She has been a member since 1976 and her sponsor was Jean Moretti. We are grateful for her many contributions to the club and her friendship to us all. Congratulations on receiving the well deserved Edna Jean Hershey Award, Minnie.

Sheila Davis, Co-Chair of the 2009 District Conference, reported on the progress made toward this event that our club is hosting October 30th – November 1st. Several committee chairs have been recruited and a location is being sought. Judy McNerny is co-chair of this event. It is expected that all club members will be involved on some level.

Sheila, also, discussed the holiday party in a little more detail. Instead of giving to ourselves by having a big expensive celebration, it was decided to give to others. So we will have a potluck dinner and put together gift bags for women at the Women's Bean Project. There are 26 women and we need to have the same items in all bags. The first item will be a \$ 25 Walmart gift card. A sign-up sheet was passed for this. Anyone wanting to add small items to the bag besides the gift cards needs to purchase 26 of it so everyone gets one. There are a number of stores where inexpensive appropriate items can be purchased, i.e., Tuesday Morning, Walmart, Big Lots, Target and the Dollar Stores. These items will be brought to the holiday party. On 12/22 at 1:00 all members who can will attend a WBP Christmas Party and take the gift bags to the women.
