CEDAW


When is the last time you thought about CEDAW? For those of you that are new to Zonta I will give you a brief summary of CEDAW, although there is nothing brief about CEDAW.

CEDAW – Elimination of All Forms of Discrimination Against Women. This is a United Nations treaty for all women's equality. It is the only international human rights treaty that focuses exclusively on women's rights and provides a universal definition of discrimination against women so those who would discriminate on the basis of sex can no longer claim that no clear definition exists. The call for action is to eliminate discrimination in many areas including politics, law, employment, education and health care. Adopted by many countries in 1979, CEDAW has been ratified by 186 of 193 UN member states world-wide.

Although President Jimmy Carter signed the treaty in 1980, the United States is one of the six member states, and the only industrial nation, that has failed to ratify CEDAW, joined by countries like Iran and Somalia.

Many frustrated US citizens simply got over trying to work with Washington on CEDAW and have ventured out on their own. One organization that has taken on this task is BPW, Business and Professional Women. They seem to have their arms wrapped around this process, which is great. There are many cities across the US that ratified CEDAW. Some of those cities are Los Angeles CA, Kansas City, MO and Miami Dade County, FL. Others are working on ratification. Recently the city council of Lafayette, CO has passed CEDAW. The cities of Boulder, Longmont, Louisville, and Westminster are actively working on passing CEDAW. It is no surprise that our sister Zontians in Boulder are working very hard for CEDAW.

There is so much more to CEDAW. If you are interested, of course you can look it up or I would be happy to have a conversation.

SERVICE COMMITTEE

Service has been busy planning all the final service activities for our 2016 grant applicants. CJ, Olette, Debbie, and Cynthia met to stuff the backpacks with all the items that our club collected and donated for Making Choices. A Making Choices graduate, a mentor, and Vie Thorsen, the director, were also present. Debbie and Olette had to make an emergency run to Safeway to get additional supplies. Olette brought refreshments for everyone to enjoy. One of the highlights of the activity was the sharing that went on between our club members and the women from Making Choices. Olette and CJ also commented on the generosity of our club members that allowed them to fill the 10 backpacks. Thank you again to our anonymous donor who donated all 10 backpacks.

On November 14, CJ, Olette, Nancy, and Judy Mc attended the Making Choices graduation at the Denver Women's Correctional Facility. Our club provided the cake, fresh fruit, and mints for the reception afterwards. We were all moved by the speeches given by three prior graduates who shared the ups and downs of their experiences after leaving prison and utilizing what they learned from Making Choices. All three women are employed, own homes, and have their own cars. The warden spoke and congratulated the current graduates. The ceremony was quite moving. During the reception we enjoyed visiting with the graduates and some of the mentors. It was a meaningful experience for all of us.

Mary and Alexis attended our meeting to discuss advocacy. The question was asked: Do our current and upcoming grant recipients need anything in the area of advocacy? We discussed the needs of each group. We mentioned that this year the service committee was intentional about the advocacy needs of each group when we interviewed them on the site visits.

Mary and Alexis also gave us an update on Zonta Wings. Our club has provided CoNeht with a prepaid Visa card so that they can immediately access the money when an emergency need arises. Mary and Alexis are keeping a record of the requests. Our club and Pikes Peak are the only Zonta clubs participating in Zonta Wings. Alexis is looking into how our members could donate their airline mileage. It was suggested that we notify

our club members every time we help a human trafficking victim. In addition, the service committee would like to include Zonta Wings in the Item of the Month rotation so that members can make a donation to the fund, if so desired. We also encouraged Alexis to speak at a meeting on the topic of how to recognize a woman or girl who is being trafficked and how to safely help her.

Debbie organized the DVI service opportunity for December. Debbie made sign up sheets that were distributed to our members during the November meeting. We will be providing Christmas gifts for 16 children. There is a \$25 limit per child. The sign up sheet included each child's name, clothes and shoes sizes, and interests. There is also a sign up for cash donations that will go towards any additional families that might be included at the last minute and also to help defray the costs of the gift cards that will be purchased for the teenagers by DVI. All gifts need to be wrapped and labeled with the child's name and brought to our Zonta Christmas party at Gwen's on December 8. There are still three children that are in need of a gift: a four-year-old boy, a two-year-old boy, and a five-year-old girl.

The **Items of the Month** for the month of December are the wrapped and labeled gifts for the DVI children and cash donations for the DVI Christmas party.

Brenda Smull, Women Veterans of Colorado

- Shared the idea of "Looking back before launching forward"
 - 100 years ago the first woman was elected to congress
 - 96 years ago, women earned the right to vote.
 - This week, Hillary Clinton was the major party candidate for president.
- Shared her story
 - Mother was a janitor, was one of five children. She was the first to go to college- her mother saved up money to put her through school.
 - Got an ROTC scholarship and joined the Army to pay for college.Was shipped to the Middle East after graduating college.
 - One of 10 women and leading a platoon of 80+ men living in a tent in the desert for 9 months as part of Operation Desert Storm.
- Enjoys mentoring women and girls- speaks at elementary schools, part of Toastmasters.
- Launching Forward:

- Women today have more respect and power than ever.
- Would like to run for office at some point.
- Opened Q&A
 - In 1989, how hard was it to command respect of the men as a 23 year old in a male dominated field?
 - First, studied so she knew what was talked about.
 - Second, faked it until she made it. (project confidence)
 - Where were you in Georgia?
 - Fort Gordon in Augusta, GA
 - What is the greatest challenge that women face in the military today and how would you deal with it as a public official?
 - Preconceived notions on our strength and the harassment
 - We are working with humans and human nature- men feel the need to protect us as women. How do we change their wiring so they don't view us as "mom"? Would continue to talk about being equals.
 - Has experience in the military helped her succeed in business?
 - Yes, because of perspective.Calm under pressure.

Proposed Local Grants to award-\$33,193

The Gathering Place-\$9,000 (Presented by Penny Burke)

The Gathering Place is Denver's only daytime drop-in center for women, children, and transgender individuals who are experiencing homelessness or poverty. This grant will support the replacement of aging household grade washers and dryers with commercial grade machines. Over 480 loads of laundry are done every month, but with this new equipment, they believe they can double that amount. Over 300 women will use it per month.

Friends of the Haven-\$7,000 (presented by Mary Lou Edwards)

The purpose of this grant is to improve the health and wellness of the Haven clients by helping to fund a smoking cessation program that will be integrated into the substance abuse treatment program. Will also be encouraged to participate with Colorado Quit Line. Objective: to offer 100% of clients smoking cessation support and counseling. \$2000 for emergency supply of nicotine patches/gums and \$5000 for counseling services.

Women Veterans of Colorado-\$1,700 (presented by Lori Disaia)

Women Veterans of Colorado's mission focuses on educating and inspiring military women veterans. The purpose of this project is to redecorate 3 rooms and supply new bed linens, towels, bedspreads, table lamps, and associated articles for those rooms, which are located at the Colorado Branch Volunteers of America's Brandon Center. This center is an emergency women's shelter with dedicated beds/rooms specifically for homeless and at-risk women veterans.

Family Tree-\$10,000 (presented by Judy Allen)

Family Tree provides emergency shelter and services to survivors of domestic violence and their children. This grant would be used to support the on-site health clinic and help the survivors pay for prescription drugs for those who left home quickly without the ability to grab these items for themselves or their children.

Dance 2B Free-\$5,000 (presented by CJ Long)

Dance 2B Free's mission is to share the healing power of dance with women in prison nationwide. Specifically, this grant will support Dance 2B Free in refining and further developing its dance classes and teacher training certification program for women who are incarcerated at the Denver Women's Correctional Facility. Look for video sent via e-mail from Nancy McWhirter.

Motion to approve new grantees as projects of the club (Judy McNerny) Second: Nikki Headlee Discussion:

- Dottie Jenkins: Is there a reason the Women's Veterans of Colorado didn't ask for more money?
 - The committee actually doubled what they applied for (\$700), however, it didn't feel comfortable just saying "here is money that is available, take it and spend it". Wish they would have asked for more, so encouraged them to ask for more next year with a full proposal.
