

It is the ultimate place for a wide

range of events. Set right in the heart of dynamic Rotterdam this attractive and multifunctional building can be home to cultural, professional and educa-

tional activities.

Because it houses both a concert hall and a congress centre, de Doelen is exceptional attractive. This is emphasized by the building's functional architecture combining a

typical 1960s style with a modern congress complex.

De Doelen has three complexes, each of which can be used separately; they are grouped around the Willem Burger Zaal, the Grote Zaal en the Jurriaanse Zaal. Each area of the complex has its own entrance, a main lobby, roomy foyers and auxiliary areas. The three complexes combined offer accommodation for up to 3,000 participants.

The congress centre is opposite the central railway station and is easy to reach via Rotterdam Airport, Schiphol Airport, only forty minutes away, or using the high-speed rail link from Brussels, London or Paris. A covered skywalk links de Doelen to hotel The Westin Rotterdam.

Zonta Club of Denver General Meeting Minutes January 11, 2007

President Sheila Davis called the meeting to order at 6:05pm.

Guests: Attending as guests were Margaret Brawley, Karen Brawley, Katherine Barnes, Pam Dumonceau, Kiffie Hester, Deb Heckart, Adelle Monteblanco, Katelyn Schwartz, and Alice West-Goers.

Invocation: Mary Benoit read a passage from <u>Reflections</u> by Sandra Stemmler.

Status of Women Moment: Nancy Long spoke about micro loans. These very small loans might be for purchasing livestock, raising crops, or selling craft items, and help impoverished people improve their economic status.

Member Moment: Barb Pellegren gave a history of the Zonta Chapel at University of Colorado Hospital. Leota Pekrul and Bobbie Razee started the chapel project in 1957, and it took three years to raise the \$10,000 budget. Artist Edgar Britton designed and created the bronze Tree of Life sculpture that hangs above the altar, as well as the wooden carvings around the door. At this time, the pews need to be refinished and the book holders need repair.

Program: Margaret Brawley spoke about the empowering women. She noted that women are responsible for 60-80 percent of food production in the world, yet 2 out of every 3 poor adults are women. Brawley spent two years in Uganda, where, together with two colleagues, she started the non-governmental organization (NGO) Communication for Development. The NGO helps people recognize and evaluate their behavior in order to improve their lives.

Also speaking at the meeting were Adelle Monteblanco, Katelyn Schwartz, and Alice West-Goers of Regis University. They described their experiences with the Tinansa Project, which includes academic, leadership, and cultural, and social components. The project culminated in a trip to Ghana, where the young women stayed with Ghanaian families and furnished books for a girls' school library.

Minutes: Minutes of the November general meeting were approved as printed in the Smoke Signal.

Membership: The club will host Area 3 on March 31st at Excelsior Youth Center in Aurora. There will be a panel of current Colorado legislators, breakout sessions, and a tour of Excelsior. Members are asked to attend, and to bring a gently used item for the girls. The Amelia Earhart dinner is scheduled for Sunday, January 28th at the JeffCo Airport Runway Grill in Broomfield.

Service/Status of Women: Carroll Allen reported that grant recipients have been invited to the February general meeting. Grants will be distributed at the meeting and each recipient is asked to give a brief description his or her organization.

Fundraising: Invitations to the Yellow Rose Ball, the club's non-event fundraiser, will be sent out soon. The mailing list includes past vendors, grant recipients, and former as well as current ZCD members. Dottie Jenkins noted that the raffle netted \$1,400, but participation was disappointing. Tickets are available for a February 18th matinee performance of the opera Elixir of Love at the Ellie Caulkins Opera House.

New Business: Sheila recognized Mandy Ziegler for her contributions to the Teen Moms cooking class, and presented her with a yellow rose pin.
