

# **Smoke Signal**



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### January Dinner Meeting 1/8/2009 hosted at the Women's Bean Project

The meeting started with the Call to Order by President Judy McNerny at 6:30 p.m. followed by the Inspirational Moment by Liz Cameron. Sheila Davis presented the Status of Women Moment.

Joetta Williams introduced her guests Rita Lusk and Deborah Bruner. Nikki Headlee presented her guest and long-time Zonta friend Marcy Kaufmann. And Mindy Craig's guest was Mary Dameron.

Sheila Davis introduced Bob Macdonald of the Women's Bean Project - guest and host of the meeting. Denise who is a client at WBP cooked 3 different excellent soups and baked yummy cornbread and cookies for the meeting. The organization just concluded an unprecedented year. They were very well publicized which resulted in huge sales of their products over this holiday season and many inquiries on how to replicate this special program. Bob explained the WBP model. This is the organizations 20th year in working with disadvantaged women, mostly in their late 30's or early 40's. Most are single mothers, 70% are felons and/or drug users, chronically unemployed or underemployed, and with little education or work history. About 50% are homeless when they arrive, 25% have been abused and all have practically no successes in their lives. This is the last chance for many. WBP offers GED classes, computer training, job search techniques, resume preparation, interviewing skills, and fundamental job skills. It is a 6 month program with a 50% success rate. Working with women at this level, 50% success is phenomenal.

Judy asked for and received approval of the November minutes as published.

Barb Pellegren reported the finances are in good shape except investments are down but not seriously.

Joetta talked about the recent holiday party at Jacki Sammon's home and the presentation of the gift bags assembled at Jacki's to the women at WBP. A permanent meeting space is yet to be determined. Stay tune to details for the February meeting. Kathy Hyzer reported for the Service Committee. There have been a number of service opportunities recently. Kathy distributed sign-up sheets for the Delores Project dinners for the next couple of months. She and Beth Mundell are meeting with the Empowerment Program people to discuss what we might be able to develop as service projects for them for 2009. Deb Heckart explained exciting new things from the Fundraising Committee. Mindy Craig enlisted an artist friend of hers to

This has the possibility of being a great relationship for all – wonderful different items for us to sell and, also, the opportunity to support a woman in business. We have the first group of bags now which we will sell at the Amelia Earhart Dinner. Mindy came up with a wonderful idea for a mini, first-time film event which may be a precursor to a larger film festival we have been considering as a fundraiser.

This will be held at the Starz Film Center at Auraria during the afternoon of Sunday, March 8th (International Women's Day). The film is A Walk to Beautiful – a documentary around the subject of obstetric fistula (a complication of prolonged labor of women in many developing nations). It tells the uplifting story of women in Ethopia who have come thru this. Mindy has talked to the producer of the film who will come from New York to participate in a Q and A after the screening of the film. A reception will follow. There is a short timeline preparing for this event so it is important for all club members to help get this off the ground. We are looking at the possibility of joining Black Tie to help with this and future fundraisers.

Sheila gave an update on progress toward the District Conference. She and co-chair Judy McNerny have just about finalized the decision on the location and the next phase will be holding team meetings. Currently, theme ideas need to be developed for presentation to Priscilla. Suggestions can be sent to Sheila. Her goal is to have 125 attendees. Advertising will be done at the Amelia Earhart Dinner and "Bee" skits will be performed at all area club meetings. This is another huge event for our club and all members need to participate. There is much to be done before the end of October.

Nikki is on the Nominating Committee and explained the deadline for nominations is 2/12. A copy of the form is in the Smoke Signal. If someone is interested in a position, she can nominate herself. You don't have to wait for someone else to do it.

Judy reviewed the recent service projects and asked for a show of hands from all who participated – dinners for the Delores Project, bell-ringing for the Salvation Army, the Santa Claus Shop and Women's Bean Project. Judy, also, presented the Z Rock to Krystie Rose and Cracked Pots to Joetta and Mindy.

Beth enlightened us with a Zonta Zinger. Then she drew the winning ticket for her door prize which was won by Kathy Hyzer.

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(from ZI): 25 November 2008 Congratulations Australia!

Zontians across the world congratulate Australia for moving to become a party to the Optional Protocol to the United Nations Convention on the Elimination of All Forms of Discrimination Against Women (CEDAW). Australia has been a party to CEDAW since 1983.

The announcement came on the eve of the International Day for the Elimination of Violence Against Women. "Acceding to the Optional Protocol will send a strong message that Australia is serious about promoting gender equality and that we are prepared to be judged by international human rights standards," said Minister for the Status of Women Tanya Plibersek.

### (summary of UN website explanation of the Optional Protocol):

The Optional Protocol includes a Communications Procedure and an Inquiry Procedure. The Communications Procedure gives individuals and groups of women the right to complaint to the Committee on the Elimination of Discrimination against Women about violations of CEDAW. The Inquiry Procedure allows the Committee to conduct inquiries into serious and systematic abuses of women's human rights in countries that become parties to the Optional Protocol. The inquiry procedure:

- Allows investigation of substantial abuses of women's human rights by an international body of experts;
- Is useful where individual communications fail to reflect the systemic nature of widespread violations of women's rights;
- Allows widespread violations to be investigated where individuals or groups may be unable to make communications (for practical reasons or because of fear of reprisals);
- Gives the Committee an opportunity to make recommendations regarding the structural causes of violations:
- Allows the Committee to address a broad range of issues in a particular country.



Dear 2008-2010 District Governors & Past Zonta International Presidents,

Good News.

In early December we told you about the 6.5% Foundation mortgage, whose 59 installments of US\$11,852 began on August 2008. We are pleased to report that the Zonta International Board found a solution to this burdensome mortgage. The mortgage used the condominium at Wacker Drive and the restricted assets of the Foundation, including our Service, ZISVAW, and scholarship funds, as collateral. The monthly payments consisted mainly of interest and a balloon payment on the principal was due in August 2013. (The use of these funds as collateral meant that payments to AE Fellows, YWPA recipients, JMK recipients, or our service projects could be at risk until the loan was paid in full.)

Zonta International made a US\$1,578,742.17 loan from the operating reserve fund to pay this mortgage debt. ZIF will then pay off this internal loan at a rate of 3.25%. The collateral for this loan is the real estate holdings at 557 West Randolph Street and 55 West Wacker Drive. The loan will be paid in full upon the sale of the real estate holdings of the Foundation. We consider this loan within the Zonta family to be short-term.

This internal loan between Zonta International and the Zonta International Foundation was possible because ZI used its reserve funds that are invested to cover multi-year contractual obligations in the event of unforeseen emergencies. This short-term loan will not affect our long-term financial viability.

Benefits of this transaction are:

- Releasing the assets from collateral to be distributed to our service projects, and our scholarship and fellowship recipients.
- Reducing the amount of interest paid by ZIF and allowing more money for service.
