Bizzy Lizzy broke her ankle a few weeks ago. Send her a card and let her know we are thinking of her even if we don't see her until tax season is over.





## January 2010 Zonta International President's Message

Dear Zontians,

Violence against women and girls is one of the most pervasive human rights violations today and has devastating effects not only on the victims of violence but on society as well. A major cause of death and disability for women ages 15 to 44, violence against women also has significant health and economic costs. Victims of violence are at a higher risk of HIV infection while the economic costs alone can impoverish individuals, families and communities, reducing the economic development of each nation. I am pleased to report that our ZISVAW projects continue to produce real results and positive changes

I am pleased to report that our ZISVAW projects continue to produce real results and positive changes for women who have experienced the threat or reality of some form of violence in their lives while our international service projects are providing access to

quality health services and opportunities for economic growth to women in need.

With Zonta's support, the Fistula Project in **Liberia** has performed surgeries on nearly 180 patients with an 89% success rate. After four months at the Rehabilitation Center, 33 women were reintegrated into their communities with support from Zonta.

The "Community-based Centre for Housing and Rehabilitation of Women Victims of Violence" in **Syria** has developed the capacity of staff and volunteers to provide quality services to survivors and has established a telephone hotline to reach women throughout Syria.

In **Egypt**, efforts continue to improve the provision of legal aid and medical and psychosocial support to

women survivors of violence. Between July and November 2008, 50 women visited the "One-Stop Centre," 17 of which received legal counseling and aid. The Prevention of Mother-to-Child Transmission (PMTCT) of HIV program in **Rwanda** has provided services to more than 650 pregnant women. Those women found to be HIV positive received appropriate antiretroviral treatment for the prevention of transmission during pregnancy. Twenty-six of the forty-five babies born to HIV infected mothers were tested for HIV at six weeks, and all of the tests were negative.

In **Cambodia**, Gender and Development for Cambodia successfully reached out to more than 10,000 people during the first year of the project – mobilizing men and women to stop domestic violence in their communities and helping to raise awareness of existing laws regarding violence against women and the legal rights of victims of violence.

At the same time, our education programs continue to empower women and promote gender equality in education. This November, we announced the 12 recipients of the 2009 Jane M. Klausman Women in

Business Scholarships. This talented group of women, representing seven countries around the world, will receive US\$5,000 each for undergraduate business studies.

The recent release of "Amelia," has brought renewed interest in the life of famed aviatrix and legendary Zontian Amelia Earhart. Epitomizing the ideals of Zonta International, Amelia Earhart encouraged women to pursue careers in fields traditionally dominated by men. Today, a new generation of women is inspired to pursue studies in aerospace-related sciences and engineering. Watch the official movie trailer, and learn more about the Amelia Earhart Fellowship Program. (Ed. I thank you for your continued support of all our international programs, and I look forward to updating you on the future progress and results of all our projects.

Committee NOW

- Set goal to raise \$5,000
- Expect that each member will participate in their own way to:
  - o sell 4 tickets each, attend with friends, and enjoy
  - o buy 4 tickets and donate to students from Metro State College Women's Studies
  - o ask a professional contact for a sponsorship: of \$250 -\$500 for specific film event component; i.e., poster printing, brochures, etc.
    - ★ As we will need several sponsors, form a committee to work on all sponsorship components and budget.
    - ★ Committee to develop list of sponsorship components and dollar amounts

Feel Good Component:
Commitment will provide for a successful event and the more members involved, the more likely that the end goal will be met. To make film day even better, along with the ZCD display, explaining what a great club we are and why everyone should want to join and/or donate (and we need to have a big jar for donations), we could (choose one or more):

- have the Ethiopian jewelry sales person there as a tie-in to the African film
- have information (with donation envelopes) about the organizations we work with (Excelsior, Empowerment, Joy House, Delores Project, others) and hopefully generate some donations for them.
- other?

Everyone agreed that the movie project was great and that we should pick a movie that has a wide appeal for all. The whole club would need to be involved in the

fund raising project. No excuses! We are such a small club that in order to have a successful event, everyone must help."

# Topic 2--Our Club: Service or Philanthropy?

Both, of course. We need to get our hands "dirty" with both. Yes, we have lots of money, but we current members didn't "earn" the bulk of it, and we may not appreciate it as much as if we did. We need to raise more & add more to the pot, to earn/deserve the privilege of giving it away and putting it to good use. And, we want to interact with the people who are served by our money. We agree with the idea of tying our service projects to our grants. Yes, our grants are wonderful, and can really help women in our community, but our grantees often need so much more than just money, and that goes double for the women they serve.

We need to make sure our grantees need our grants and our hands-on involvement. Many other philanthropic groups (Junior League, etc.--Denver has lots!) also contribute to some of our grantees. If we find groups that don't get so much other attention, our contributions will be used for more basic things, and will have more impact on the women being served. These groups might also have more opportunities for us to be "hands-on" useful.

We want to provide a good variety and number of service projects to engage current members at their diverse skill and comfort levels. Not so many as to have us be scattered and not see another Zontian when we're participating in service projects, but enough that we can attract all members to one or more of the projects. And possibly to "lure new victims" to projects, and maybe, to membership.


Action steps: Determine what help the current grantees could use from us and develop those into service projects. These should engage a variety of members' talents, time and energy levels, and perhaps spouse availability.

Success of this idea should be able to be measured by increased member satisfaction (do we have a current benchmark of this level?), increases in service hours and perhaps (!), increases in numbers of members.

It was agreed that whatever we choose to do it must benefit women and improve their status. We like the Delores Project but need to do more than just feed them a meal. Most are not available on Sunday evenings and the cost is also a factor. The group agreed that educating women is key to helping them return to the workforce in order to become independent. Any project we choose, again, the whole club needs to be involved. We are down to about 20 active members (only 16 now on our permanent reservation list). If we spread ourselves too thin, we won't accomplish anything. Need fewer projects with more involvement. That's how we get our name out there and actually do some good!

Advocacy: Members request that Alice Borodkin and the Board choose two or three specific bills that are interesting to our membership. The President and Board would choose one or two bills that ZCD would focus on.
