# What and Who is Lurking in the Halls of the Colorado Capitol?

Well, it's hard to know if you didn't attend the Zonta Day at the Capitol! Although those of you who didn't attend doubtless had good reasons, you missed a very interesting day.

When our group was just getting together Mary Benoit heard a familiar voice. It was Su Ryden, Representative from District 36 (Aurora). Mary says "Su's company worked on PR and marketing for my company many years ago in one of her former lives. It was great to see her and catch up. Most interesting was that when she was introduced to the others in our group, she immediately asked each of us 'When are you running?' There was no doubt in her mind that we should all run for office. WOW! This reflects back to when our club was visited by The White House Project."

We learned much from the staff of Legislative Services ("without whom an elected official would be lost," Alice is quick to testify). Chris Ward, Fiscal Note Manager, and Susan Liddle, Research Staff, described duties completed by them and their staffs in support of our elected legislators. For example:

• Staff members actually research, write and summarize all proposed legislation based on legislators' requests. All proposed legislation requires a one page summary describing the Bill's intent.

Additionally, economic impacts are also researched and included.

- Often, they use laws in other states as models.
- Each Staff member researches approximately 75 proposed bills in an average year (350 to 400 bills).
- The staff writes Colorado's annual Blue Book, describing each ballot issue, and its pros and cons.
- $\sim~$  Only Colorado produces a voter guide created by state employees.

~ Interested parties (pro and con, organizations and individuals) are interviewed for each ballot item and every word is reviewed for understanding by the 'average' voter. The goal is to make the guide as unbiased as possible. If the language is a bit boring, then staff feels they have achieved their goal.

~ Each ballot item has approximately three individuals on the writing team.

~ Research for the Blue Book begins in April, as probable ballot items are identified, and completed in August when the final ballot issues are known. Final printing and mailing is completed by the first week of September.

- Staff members meet with groups for voter education, to explain legislative processes.
- Legislative Services is responsible for the General Assembly web page, where you can track bills through the legislative session.

• Staff members also respond to calls from voters and will try to solve problems for callers, even though the problems have nothing to do with the legislature or the legislative process.

They were so interesting that Alice plans to ask Chris and Susan to be speakers at a future Zonta meeting.

Senators Morgan Carroll, District 29, and Linda Newell, District 26

(both Arapahoe County) spent time with us before going to the floor of the Senate. These two Senators are participating in several key committees, including Health and Welfare and Early Childhood. Senator Newell offered us the future opportunity to shadow her for a portion of her day.

Although the senators said each representative has their own preferences, for them and many of their colleagues the best way to communicate with them is via email. They review their email daily, usually late in the evening, and try to respond right away. They suggested that you send emails and put the bill number and whether you are a constituent in the subject line. Brevity is appreciated and bullet points or fact sheets are a good way to communicate your major points in support of or against a bill or issue.

Next we went to observe proceedings in the House. Because we were such a small group, we were able to sit on the House floor, about four feet from

the legislators! We watched and listened, although not much of substance was happening because it was so early in the session. (Perhaps for that reason, it didn't appear that most of the *legislators* were watching or listening at all!) We were introduced to several legislators and, surprise, they were human beings, eager to meet

> us and speak to us! Among others, we met House Minority Leader Mark Ferrandino, District 2 (Denver) and State Rep. Joe Miklosi, District 9 (Denver and Arapahoe) who is running for the U.S. Congress in District 6.

> (As an aside, Judy says, "Months ago I suggested to a client that he contact his

state representative, Joe Miklosi. The client has a problem, but can't afford the legal fees to go to court. Recently the client followed my suggestion and last week we both talked to Joe, who made some phone calls to try to use 'political pressure' to help my client! I would never have thought of suggesting this if Alice hadn't told us that legislators are willing and eager to be of service to their constituents whenever they can.")

Su Ryder introduced us to Rhonda Fields, Representative from District 42 (Aurora).

Mary says, "It was an honor to meet Rhonda Fields. For those of you who may not remember, her son Marshall and his fiancée were murdered because they were

## 2012 ZONTA DAY OF FILM

#### ZCD's Fourth Annual Day of Film is Almost Here!

Our Day of Film this year features *Saving Face*, a powerful film about a British-Pakistani plastic surgeon who treats Pakistani victims of acid attacks. The film follows some of these women as they grapple with what happened to them. *Saving Face* is also a story of hope about Pakistani women helping each other, including a female Pakistani lawyer who took the case of one victim and managed to convict the perpetrator. Nominated for an Oscar in the 'Best Documentary, Short subject' category, *Saving Face* will air on HBO this March as well. We will be part of the film's world premiere week. Our screening will be followed by a discussion with one of the directors, producers, a Pakistani national, and culminate with a brunch.

The event will be held at the Denver FilmCenter Colfax on Saturday, March 10, 2012 at 10am. The \$40 ticket includes the screening, parking, the panel discussion and catered brunch.

Tickets will be sold through BlackTie Colorado, via a link from our website <u>www.zonta-denver.org</u>. As in previous years the film event is a fundraiser for our Foundation and the proceeds will go toward projects that advance the status of women both locally and worldwide. If individuals cannot attend they may want to make a tax-deductable donation to the Zonta Club of Denver Foundation, a 501(c)(3) organization. If people should ask what our prior funding efforts and projects in the Denver area are, you could mention the Excelsior Youth Center, a residential treatment center servings girls ages 11-18 with emotional and behavior difficulties; the Empowerment Program's Chrysalis Project, providing substance abuse, cognitive, behavioral, mental health and trauma services to women arrested for prostitution in Denver; The Providence Network's Joy House, a two-year transitional housing program that offers help and healing to low -income, abused women and children who have left violent domestic situations and are seeking to rebuild their lives; and The Delores Project, providing overnight shelter and other services to unaccompanied adult women who are homeless and have limited resources-to name a few.

Since 1927, Zonta Club of Denver has been a chapter of Zonta International through which thousands of women worldwide work in their communities and with the UN and other international organizations to help women achieve social justice and economic self-sufficiency, among other goals. For 84 years, the Zonta Club of Denver has given many thousands of hands-on volunteer hours and over \$2 million to encourage metro-area women to improve their economic status.

By supporting the 2012 Day of Film, you will help ZCD to raise funds for our service projects and to raise awareness of women's issues!

lotions, gels, oils, gift cards that you are not going to use – anything you think will be a good addition. We thank you for your help in filling the basket.



witnesses to a gang-related killing." Rhonda and the mother of Marshall's fiancée advocated tirelessly for the perpetrators to be brought to justice (they were) and for legislation to protect witnesses. This courageous woman realized that the only way to change the world was to run for office and put the advocacy skills she learned through her personal tragedy to work to benefit her community and the State of Colorado.

Each of the women legislators that we met displayed a passion for women's and children's issues that closely correspond to the mission of Zonta. For example, **Representative Fields is** sponsoring a bill that would facilitate prosecution of sexual assaults against the handicapped. She is proposing the legislation because a family in her district came to her after their mentally disabled daughter was raped. Because the daughter is not able to describe what happened so a jury could understand, the rapist is safe from prosecution. Rhonda's bill would treat such an adult the same way the law treats a child victim, and allow testimony by third persons (the woman's mother, in this case) who do understand what the victim is trying to communicate. This is a thorny legal issue, and although Rhonda doesn't expect success her constituent family will at least know that someone tried to help and, who knows? some day the law may be changed to allow justice in a case like this.

When the House session was over, Alice led us into the lobby outside the House floor (this is where the lobbyists lurk—hence the name) and introduced us to a number of actual lobbyists. Surprise, they were human beings, too! We visited at some length with Detective White, a lobbyist for Denver Police Department and (is this sexist?) a very handsome man! We had an excellent discussion with him about human trafficking. He encouraged us to contact him if we had ideas for new trafficking

laws or for making existing laws work better in practice.

Thanks to Alice for organizing this event and to her daughter, Julie, for her help. It was very worthwhile; although our numbers were small, we learned a lot.


#### **TOFFEE BARS**

Whole graham crackers 2 cubes of butter 1 cup brown sugar6 plain chocolate bars or package of chocolate chips

Line a greased 11-1/2" x 17" cookie sheet (with sides) with whole graham crackers. Melt 2 cubes of butter and the brown sugar - bring to a boil for 3 minutes. Pour over the graham crackers and bake at 325 degrees for 10 minutes. Remove from oven and cool slightly before laying the chocolate bars or chocolate chips on the top so they will melt. Sprinkle chopped nuts of your choice over the top. Cut carefully into desired size with sharp knife. So easy and so yummy!
