ADVOCACY AND AWARENESS DAY

The Human Trafficking Task Force of Southern Colorado is sponsoring its second annual ADVOCACY AND AWARENESS DAY at the Colorado State Capitol on Thursday, February 20, 2013.

This event supports the mission of the Task Force, which is "to build a collaboration of organizations and individuals to reduce human suffering caused by human trafficking, through advocacy, awareness, rehabilitation, and services for survivors."

The Department of State has estimated that 80% of victims of cross-border human trafficking are female and up to 50% are minors; hundreds of thousands of these women and children are used in prostitution each year.

Two of the Objects of Zonta International are "to improve the legal, political, economic, educational, health and professional status of women at the global & local level through service & advocacy," and "to promote justice and universal respect for human rights & fundamental freedoms."

Attendance at the Advocacy and Awareness Day at the Capitol is one way for Zontians and others who support Zonta's goals to advocate for the eradication of human trafficking. Come to the Capitol on February 20 and show members of the Colorado legislature how strongly you, their constituents, support legislation against trafficking.
