On February 19, the Human Trafficking Task Force of Southern Colorado will sponsor its annual program of events at the Colorado State Capitol to raise awareness about human trafficking. All are welcome to keep pressure on law makers and law enforcement to give priority to fighting this crime.

The event will include a powerful exhibit by iEmpathize about trafficking in Colorado, the introduction of human trafficking resolutions in the House and Senate at sessions that the public can view from the galleries above the two chambers, presentations by four women working in the field on "the four Ps to end human trafficking: prevention, protection, prosecution and partnerships," and conclude with a rally featuring top law enforcement officials and a talk by a trafficking survivor.

This is a powerful event, it's free to attend, and you can show your support for the efforts to end trafficking just by being there.

If you want to go a step further, make an appointment that morning with your state representative and senator between 8:30 and 9:00 a.m. Make sure they are aware of the need for their support of efforts to strengthen Colorado laws to make it easier to convict human traffickers, like the people who sold children for sex at the National Western Stock Show last month.

And the day doesn't need to be all serious. Meet friends and attend together; have lunch afterwards. Contact Judy McNerny if you would like to join some Zonta friends at the event.

Zonta's Day of Film 2015

Jhola

The seventh Zonta's Day of Film on March 21 will feature Jhola, Nepal's submission for an Oscar in the best foreign language film category.

Jhola is a dramatization of the Hindu tradition of Sati in which a widow was forced to burn herself on the funeral pyre of her spouse.



Jhola tells the story of Kanchhi, an exceptionally beautiful young woman married to an old man. When her husband dies, Sati tradition requires that Kanchhi jump into his funeral pyre. However, the movie is not all gloom.

Although Jhola was not nominated for an Academy Award, actress Garima Panta did win the best actress award for her role at a regional film festival. The film won accolades at its screening at the 2014 Zonta International Convention.

Although Sati was officially abolished in Nepal in 1920, abuse of widows continues to this day. There is documentation of Sati being practiced as late as 2008, and word of mouth indicates it may still be adhered to.

However horrific the practice of Sati, the movie also shows the redeeming strength of people banding together to improve their circumstances.

Zonta's Day of Film 2015 will feature the screening of Jhola, as part of the Women + Film VOICES Film Festival, followed by a champagne brunch. Tickets are \$40 and can soon be purchased at zonta-denver.org. Don't miss this extremely limited release of Jhola, and bring friends!

Minutes

Minutes - Zonta Meeting - November 13, 2014

The November Zonta meeting was held at The Hacienda with 21 members and guests attending. The meeting was called to order by Pres Mary Benoit at 6:30. Julie Bradley gave the Advocacy Moment.

Minutes of October meeting were approved as written. Under Treasurer's Report, Kathy Hyzer asked for approval of amended 2014-2015 budget. An error was in the budget approved at the August meeting. The \$1742 that was used to plug last year's budget was removed, and the budget was approved as amended. Nikki moved and Olette seconded.

Our speaker for the evening was Jennifer (?) the house manager for the three houses at Still Waters Housing, (Open Door Ministries) one of our grant recipients. She talked about the houses and the 15 women housed there. One house is for single women, one for women with children, and the third for women leaving the sex industry. Average stay is one year, but they would like them to stay 2 years. She spoke about two women who received educational assistance from our grant.

Committee Reports

PR - New brochures are out and available, thanks to Wendy for facilitating updating the brochures and arranging the printing. Julie suggested using MeetUp to sign up for meetings, and she will send out an email with instructions. We have already had one guest who found us on MeetUp. Smoke Signal submissions need to be in PDF or the body of an email.

Advocacy - Judy McNerny will have a meeting by conference call next Wed. Lines are full, but if someone wants to attend, they can come to Judy's office. She passed a sign up sheet for the advocacy Moment for next year.

Membership - There will be a social event Jan 25 from 6:30 to 8:30 at Celebrity Lanes at Parker and Arapahoe. Members are invited to bring family members, grandchildren, friends etc. The cost for bowling is about \$20, and members will be asked to pay in advance in December. Food and drinks are extra.

Service - The service grants were announced by members of the committee with a total of \$31,419 available for local projects. The Foundation Trustees approved the grants that come from Foundation funds.

Penny spoke about Open Door Ministries. Since we had already heard about the project, she was brief. \$10,000 has been granted. As this will be their third year, they will have to sit out a year next year.

Olette and Kate presented Second Chances, which has a furniture store in South Denver. They work with very hard core women, mentoring and training them to function in a work environment. Our grant of \$5000 will enable them to purchase computers and train the clients in their use.

Nancy presented the remaining grants:

- \$10,000 to Delores Project continuing their Steps to Stability program, which will assist 22 women to get into independent living.
- \$4880 to Friends of the Haven, which will continue their exercise program for their residents.
- \$1500 to Hands of the Carpenter. This is a new organization for Zonta, and they
 provide auto repair and car maintenance education for widows and single
 mothers. They have partnered with an auto parts store and the women pay a
 portion of the cost of repairs. The purpose is to keep the clients mobile so they
 can get to jobs and day care.

17,169 was available for International, and the committee allocated 10,000 for one Amelia Earhart Fellowship and 7,169 to ZISVAW.

The Club voted to approve two new organizations as service projects. Nancy moved to ask for approval of Hands of the Carpenter and Second Chances. Approved.

The funds from Club Service were voted on by the members. That includes \$1500 for JMK Scholarship and \$500 for a new local project chaired by Alexis. It is Zonta Wings, and will provide emergency travel funds for women needing immediate removal from human trafficking situations. Nancy Moved to approve Club Service funds. Approved.

Holiday Party will again be at The Haven, and we will be serving about 60 people, including our members. Similar to last year, we will provide dinner, decorate the tree and sing carols. Nancy put up sign up sheets for food donations. The committee also

voted to provide a gift bag for 5 women, consisting of one bra, two panties, one pair of pj's and two socks. Members signed up for those gifts. Julie will be putting out an email for members who were not at the meeting to sign up. We will need the assistance of everyone to make this evening a success.

Fund Raising - Still looking for a film, one film they liked was too costly. We already have on sponsorship of \$300 from our bank, ANB. Thanks to Nikki for getting that donation after years of trying!

Zonta Says No - Mary reported on the event, which was very successful. Still don't know about the money, but attendance was very good, and it provided great PR and getting the word out about Zonta.

The 50-50 drawing was held, and \$31 was won by Kathy Hyzer/.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:00 pm.
