As I mentioned last month, the Committee has finalized its arrangements with CoNEHT (Colorado Network to End Human Trafficking) for \$500 of Club funds to be made available for Zonta Wings-emergency transportation of human trafficking victims. Representatives of CoNEHT will speak at our March club meeting. We will learn more then about what the network is able to accomplish here in Denver.

President's Message

February is National Heart month. It is know that women have a different type of heart attacks than men. Research on women and heart attacks lags far behind men. An average of 53,000 women die each year from heart attacks. This occurs because of misdiagnoses from underlying causes. There have been improvements over the last decade, but women have worse results from attacks than men.

It means women often don't receive lifesaving medications. More women than men die each year from the first attack. 26% of women versus 19% of men die within the first year. Women do tend to have smaller blood vessels , they



are older when they have attacks than men and probable have other conditions such as diabetes and high blood pressure. How many countries are involved in voices Against Violence?

Women are more likely to wait longer than men to seek help. Men go to a hospital within 15 hours of first symptoms, while women will take more than 2 days . Heart attacks can be deadlier to younger women, she will be sicker than young men and more likely to die in the hospital. Women experience different types of symptoms, shortness of breath, nausea, or vomiting, moving into the back, up the jaw and into the head. Men experience shoulder pain and down the arm which is very general.

Experiencing the crushing pain within your chest, pain generating up your neck into the jaw area, and the clammy feeling is what I experienced when I was having what I thought was a heart attack earlier this month. I remembered to take an aspirin, call 911 and wait for the paramedics. It is the most frighten experience. I had a heart cath yesterday that showed I didn't have a heart attack, but what is called a-typical attack. It shows that no matter how healthy you are there are many things that can and do contribute to an attack.




