Zonta Club of Denver's Ninth annual Day of Film will feature *No Job For A Woman*. The film is directed by Michelle Midori Fillion and narrated by Julianna Margulies.

When World War II broke out, reporter Martha Gellhorn was so determined to get to the frontlines that she left husband Ernest Hemingway, never to be reunited. Ruth Cowan's reporting was hampered by a bureau chief who refused to talk to her. Meanwhile, photojournalist Dickey Chappelle wanted to get so close to the action that she could feel bullets whizzing by. This award-winning documentary tells the colorful story of how these three tenacious war correspondents forged their now legendary reputations during the war— when battlefields were considered no place for a woman.

The Day of Film will be March 4, 2017, at the Tivoli Center at Metropolitan State University of Denver. Doors will open at 9:30 a.m., the film will start at 10:00 and be followed by a discussion with the director and champagne brunch.

The proceeds from last year's event went to the Family Tree. This non-profit organization

is committed to helping individuals, families and communities break the inter-generational cycles of child abuse, domestic violence and homelessness.

DENVER WOMEN'S MARCH



On Saturday, January 21st, ZCD members Judy McNerny, Mary Benoit, Sheila Davis and Marian Lee gathered to attend the Women's March in downtown Denver. Gwen Fornia and Alexis Newton also attended. In a massive showing for "human rights and equality," tens of thousands of people from across Colorado flooded Civic Center Park, including men and children as well as women. People flowed into the park from all directions, even as the crowd began to slowly funnel out into the parade route through the city. Many were carrying signs, and a large number of women were wearing pink hats that signaled solidarity with the national Pussyhat project. There were people of all ages, including an elderly woman being pushed in a wheelchair while she held a sign that read "Now you've made Nanna mad."

The Denver rally was one of hundreds of women's marches taking place worldwide. Massive numbers of people filled the National Mall in Washington, D.C., the Boston Common and Pershing Square in Los Angeles. Wendy Henry-Moraskie joined a smaller-sized Womens' March in New Orleans, while there for a visit. In Denver, so many people showed up for the rally that they began to divert from the parade route, filling the 16th Street Mall for blocks. By 11:30 a.m., Jessica Rogers, one of the event organizers, estimated that the crowd had swelled to more than 100,000 people.

On the Facebook page for the event, organizers described the goal of the march as providing an outlet and support for those who wish to:

- 1) Advocate for and defend the most marginalized members of our society.

- 2) Connect with like-minded individuals and organizations within local Colorado communities.
 - 3) Serve as a model of peaceful demonstration for the young women and men, and girls and boys, who will be the leaders of tomorrow.
 - 4) Honor the women and men who have come before us and fought for human and women's rights.

Though large, the rally was peaceful and a great example of democracy and advocacy at work, of people gathering to make their views known to their leaders.

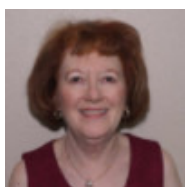

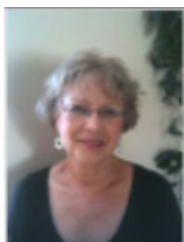

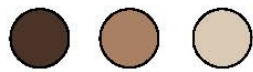

Join us at the 2017 North American Inter-District Meeting in the Washington, D.C. area from 2-4 June 2017 at the four star Hilton McLean Tysons Corner Hotel. The theme of this year's meeting is "Be Part of Zonta ACTION".

On Friday, 2 June, we will travel to Washington, D.C. by train to advocate for Zonta's issues on Capitol Hill. Zontians will meet at the U.S. Capitol, be briefed by a member of the International Advocacy Committee, then visit a state senator or congressman's office to advocate for Zonta issues. There will be no cost for the event, but each participant will be responsible for providing their own transportation and lunch. There is a complimentary shuttle from the hotel to the Silver Line metro station, which is one mile from the hotel.

Friday evening will include a buffet and roundtable discussions with experts on various Zonta topics. Saturday will feature a general session, workshops, and lunch and dinner, both with speakers. There will be more workshops on Sunday morning followed by brunch and a recap of all the information presented. (See workshop information below.)

International President Sonja Hönig Schough will participate the North American Inter-District Meeting then hold an International Board Meeting in the hotel following our meeting.

This is an opportunity for you to meet with state representatives; talk with Zonta International's leadership; learn new information on advocacy, leadership, membership and service; spend time with Zontians from all over the United States and Canada, and perhaps spend a little time shopping at the nearby Tysons Corner Shopping Centers, two of the major shopping centers of Northern Virginia.

Early registration will begin 1 January and PayPal will be available to accommodate credit cards on the 2017 NAIDM website. The website, www.northamericanmeeting2017.com, is online and you can view our comprehensive program, details of our Capitol Hill Day, hotel information and other NAIDM information.

Early registration, from 1 January to 1 March will be \$220.00; standard registration will be from 2 March to 1 May and will cost \$235.00, and late registration begins on 2 May and will cost \$250.00. The registration fee includes the program as well as Friday night appetizers, Saturday lunch and dinner and Sunday brunch. Hotel rooms will cost \$109.00 a night from 31 May - 6 June, giving you a place to stay if you decide to do a little touring of the U.S. Capitol either before or after the event. The hotel is conveniently located 13 miles from Washington Dulles airport.
