Nikki and I thanked her for her donation there and wished she and her little boy a Merry Christmas.

About 10 minutes later, she reappeared parking her Mercedes in the parking lot and delivering Nikki and I two cups of coffee she had purchased at Starbucks. This not only warmed our hearts, but our spirits as well. This is what the season is all about. So, if you wish to experience some joy like this, think about volunteering next year. "Thanks to all of you who sent encouraging e-mails and cards when, first, Dave had three stents put in his heart and, five days after he got out of the hospital, my mother was hospitalized with pneumonia, congestive heart failure, pulmonary edema, and strep in the lungs and heart.
