President Sheila's January Message...

As I look out the window of my homeoffice today, I see snow – again – or still. It's a good thing the rose bushes winter well, because I can't see the tops of them now, and the dogs are having a hard time getting through the yard. It's looks like a winter wonderland out there however. The spruce trees and the pine trees in the yards are gorgeous. After the snow first started, some of them looked like they had been sprinkled with powdered sugar, and now they look like those Christmas tree candles we use to decorate with in our living rooms.

Before the snows came (it seems like months ago), I had been noticing one of my neighbor's blue spruce trees, now about 20' tall, and how pretty it was covered with snow from one of our earlier storms (see picture). I remember about 15 years ago when my neighbor back then, Kathy, planted it and a couple of other spruce trees. She said eventually they would make a good screen between all the yards, and that she was not planting them for her necessarily, but for the neighbors that would follow.

Thinking about that tree reminds me of the work that Nikki and I are beginning to do to document some of the activities the club does on an ongoing basis. It became very obvious to me when I began my presidency, that the club does many functions over and over, or at least once a year. It seems very little has been written down regarding the process of doing the activity and the associated documents required for it. If something was written down, it's in a box somewhere, and not easy to find. With today's computer technology and storage capabilities, the information

could be documented and stored on something other than paper, take up much less space, and hopefully be easier to find. The preceding years' important documents, such as the service grant spreadsheets could be saved electronically in a central place also. We're just dipping our toes in the water of this effort this year. A great deal more planning and thinking needs to go into this project. We're calling this effort documenting our procedures. I wish I could think of a more exciting name, but it's what we're doing - documenting procedures. We are doing this for us, but we're also doing it for Zontians that follow, to make their job easier.

Along the lines of doing things for the long term, our club has a trust fund (the Hershey Trust) that is able to make grants and loans to needy Zontians in Colorado. Awhile back, we made a loan to a woman who needed some financial help. Judy McNerny, the chair of the trust committee, received the following email from her the other day, "Thank you again for your help and for the loan. Zonta is a Godsend." This is what our club and Zonta International is all about. We help women in need. I saw an excellent quote the other day by Robert Kennedy that sums up what we do, "Few will have the greatness to bend history itself, but each of us can work to change a small portion of events."




