

Community Information Update

THE CONFLICT CENTER 6TH ANNUAL AMBASSADOR OF PEACE AWARD SET FOR OCTOBER 3 Elizabeth Loescher to be Honored; Swanee Hunt, former U. S. Ambassador to Serve as Keynote Speaker

Just this past year, terrorist attacks stunned America to the large-scale reality of war and violence on its home soil. This year a local organization is reaffirming its commitment to peace and honoring one of its own for her lifelong work in reducing levels of physical, verbal and emotional violence. On Thursday, October 3, The Conflict Center, a Denver-based non-profit organization working to reduce violence at home, at school, at work and in the community will honor retired Executive Director Elizabeth Loescher as the recipient of its 6th Annual Ambassador of Peace Award.

Loescher, a 25-year Denver resident, started The Conflict Center in 1987 in the basement of her home, and since that time has overseen the organization's growth and the community's broad acceptance of the Center's work. She also has worked internationally with a group called Women Waging Peace, and has written and traveled extensively to share her message of non-violent conflict resolution. She was recently honored by the Zonta Club of Denver as the recipient of their 2002 Pacesetter Award, and by the Women's Foundation with the 2002 Unique Women of Colorado Award.

Highlighting the evening's event will be a keynote address by Swanee Hunt, a former Denver resident and now director of the Women and Public Policy Program at Harvard University's Kennedy School of Government, where she also teaches. In 1999, she founded the program Women Waging Peace, an international organization with the goal of increasing the role of women as peace negotiators across the globe. Hunt previously served as U. S. Ambassador to Austria during the Clinton administration, and founded the Women's Foundation of Colorado.

The event theme for 2002 is "A Peace-full World" and will be held at the Denver Doubletree Hotel, 3203 Quebec from 6:00 PM to 9:00 PM on Thursday, October 3. Individual tickets are available for \$100, with sponsorships beginning at \$1,000. Quiz in Women's History

American women have been contributing in the professional fields as well as in the nurture of family and community from before our nation was founded until today. Test yourself on how much you know about these wonderful women! Women and Civil Rights

Q : She is primarily remembered as a founder of the Settlement House Movement and the first American Woman to receive the Nobel Peace Prize.

A : Jane Addams is portrayed as the selfless giver to the poor as well as a labor reformer to improve working conditions for children and women and was a founder of the NAACP (National Association for the Advancement of Colored People). She worked for Chicago municipal suffrage and became first vice-president of the National American Women suffrage Association in 1911. Meet Jane Addams in her autobiography, Twenty Years at Hull House.

Women in Law

Q: Even though she graduated third in her class at Stanford Law School in 1952, the only offer she received from a major law firm was for a secretarial position. Name the Court's 102nd justice and its first female member.



A: Sandra Day O'Connor was nominated to the Supreme Court on July 7, 1981. Justice O'Connor held the deciding vote for such controversial decisions as a constitutional right to abortion, state affirmative action, mental capacity standards for the death penalty, and school player. She has been a strong advocate of state autonomy and the development of the Establishment Clause jurisprudence. She received the Women Making History Award in 1999.

Zonta International Service Projects Through the Years (part 4)

1992-1994 **Enhancing Opportunities for** Women in Development project in cooperation with UNIFEM in Ghana improved women's productivity and their access to financial resources. This project involved 3,600 participants and set up 90 Community Credit Committees to offer revolving loans to women.

- 1992-1994 Women and Pesticides: Training and Education projects in cooperation with UNIFEM in India. Sri Lanka and Bangladesh reduced damage caused by pesticides by training more than 500 women in correct pesticide usage.
- 1990-1992 Integrated Development for Women in Sericulture project in cooperation with UNIFEM in India worked with 500 women to improve crop and silk production and raise participant's awareness of related women's issues in development. The World Bank expanded this pilot project.
- 1990-1992 Agricultural Training of Young Rural Women project in cooperation with UNIFEM in Togo resulted in the training of 256 women in agricultural practices and encouraged their participation in community and national development.
- 1990-1992 **Revolving Loan Fund for Village** Women project in cooperation with UNIFEM in the Delta and **Upper Egypt** worked to establish a revolving loan program for women's income generating activities that initially served 300 women.
