The Membership Committee has a new mantra -- "44 for '08." Our goal is to increase our club's membership by 10% during the 2007-2008 club year. We have started the year with 40, including quite a few brand new, enthusiastic members. The committee will be working hard to keep as many of our current members as possible, and to recruit enough new members, to finish the year with 44. We ask all members' help in this effort.

Most important, we want to retain each of you as an active member! Whether to remain a member and to be active in Zonta are individual decisions for each member. However, other members can be important in influencing those decisions, especially with our newest members. The Membership Committee cannot do this job without your help. The committee will be asking for volunteers to serve as mentors to newer members; preparing guidelines and suggestions for mentors; and offering more opportunities for fellowship. We hope you will volunteer when asked and follow through, or just try to get to know some new people, whether at meetings, a fellowship event, fund-raiser, or service project.

Also, we have started planning a mid-September open house to introduce potential new members to Zonta. For the open house to be a success, we need YOU!

First -- the guests. A good prospect is a professional or business executive, male or female, interested in improving the status of women worldwide through service and advocacy, willing to commit his or her time to that effort, and financially able to pay dues, attend meetings, and contribute to our fund-raising and service projects. First step: compile a list of family members, friends, colleagues, clients/customers, neighbors and other acquaintances (think outside the box!) that you think might be good prospects. Second step: talk to each person on your list about Zonta. Third step: if there is interest, provide us with names and addresses and the committee will take it from there. Start the first step today!

Second -- a place. Let Judy McNerny or Joetta Williams know if you have an idea for a good location other than the King mansion, whether your place of business, the clubhouse in your community, or even your home. It must be large enough to accommodate 30 to 40 people comfortably and preferably allow us to serve wine

President Nikki's July Message...

What a great start we've gotten off to. The all member retreat was fun, gave us a chance to know each other better, and had some great discussion and ideas. By now, most of the committees have met to determine their goals and get a great start to the new Zonta year!

One of the things that became apparent during our June 2 meetings was that we have not done a good job of clarifying when a new member must take advantage of the Club paying for their registration at the area and district meetings. Our area meetings are usually held in April. So, anyone who became a new member in April, 2007, through March, 2008, would have their registration paid by the club for the area meeting in April, 2008. District meetings are usually held toward the end of September or the beginning of October. Anyone who became a member from September, 2006, through August, 2007, would have their registration paid for the district meeting coming up the last weekend in September of this year in Spear Fish, Wyoming. It's a great way to meet other Zontians from the clubs in our district, which include Montana and Wyoming clubs.

Thanks to all of you who completed the member survey. I thought all of you would like to know the results. To date, I've received 27 surveys, which are summarized below:

1. Would you be in favor of our nonevent fundraiser (Yellow Rose Ball) being continued for another year?

23 were in favor of continuing; 3 opposed; 1 did not indicate yes or no but made the comment that working together to raise money is community building, would cheerfully go along with any decision, and pointed out that one area club makes \$40,000 with fund rais-

ers. Two of the yes responders had comments such as preferring to have a real, hands-on fundraiser and perhaps the Yellow Rose Ball should be every other year.

2. Do you feel we have enough handson service projects?

8 felt we had enough; 15 felt we did not have enough; 2 had no answer.

3. Regarding programs, do you like the balance between women-oriented programs and other programs presented this past year?

23 responded yes; 1 responded no; 3 did not answer the question.

4. Should we plan more events strictly for the purpose of fellowship?

20 responded yes; 4 responded no; 3 did not answer.

5. What time would you like our monthly meetings to end?

The answers were all over the place. 7 said 8, 3 said 8 to 8:30, 6 said 8:30, 2 said 8:15, 3 said 8:30 to 9, 1 said 8 to 9; 1 said when they need to; 2 said same as now, and 2 did not answer. Since the majority were in the 8 to 8:30 range, I will endeavor to have the meetings end by 8:30 at the latest.

Many of the 2nd, 3rd, and 4th questions had comments, which have been passed along to the appropriate committee. These comments will good guidelines to aid committees in planning. We seem to have some clear majorities. As in everything in life, though, it's impossible to please everyone.

SERVICE COMMITTEE

- The Service Committee has had its first meeting, noted the concerns you expressed on the member survey, and is developing new service projects that focus on improving the status of women and children. Look for more Teen Mom opportunities, and other projects, some with "old" friends and some with new. Dress For Success is back in town, and we'll be collecting seasonal professional wear in good condition. They especially need business clothing in sizes 18W to 26W. Keep in mind that you can drop off women's and children's clothing any time at Heritage Cleaners for The Gathering Place, a women's day shelter. You don't have to wait for a specific date, and Heritage will provide you with a tax receipt.
- We're continuing our affiliation with Bonfils Blood Center as a donor group. Donating whole blood takes about an hour, including the yummy cookies and juice. Consider going in over the summer, when donations typically drop by 20% despite continuing need. Mention that you would like to have your donation listed under Zonta Club of Denver, and the receptionist will look up our number. Have questions or don't know if you're eligible? Call Bonfils at 303.363.2202, or visit the website at www.bonfils.org.
- Regarding the question of how to count service hours, District 12 Service Chair Mary Walker sends this description from the District 12 Club Manual: "Service hours include the time members spend on service projects the club has adopted. The determination is based on whether the club has taken on responsibility for the project, not how many members participate. Service hours do not include time spent on projects the club has not adopted nor the time spent on fundraising for local, district and international service projects, because this effort is reflected by the contribution." Don't forget to include prep time, for example shopping and cooking for meal service. Projects the club has adopted are those organizations to which we have given grants, plus the ones specifically voted on by the Club (e.g. Bonfils).
