

Kathy Hyzer reported on Fundraising as the new chair, Judy Bederman, couldn't attend. She will host a scarf-making session. And there will be a wine tasting at Solera on July 12th from 5 to 7 p.m. – cost \$25.


In addition we will distribute the "Pink Book" which tells you everything you wanted to know about your legislator.



ZONTIANS IN THE KITCHEN

Banana Nut Bars — From Carroll Allen

1 c. butter, cubed 2 eggs

1/2 c. water 1 tsp. vanilla extract 1 tsp. vanilla extract 2 c. all-purpose flour

1/2 c. packed brown sugar 1 tsp. baking soda

1 c. mashed ripe bananas (about 2 medium) 1/2 c. chopped pecans or walnuts


1/2 c. buttermilk

In a small saucepan, bring butter and water to a boil. Remove from the heat; set aside. In a large bowl, beat the sugars, bananas, buttermilk, eggs and vanilla until blended. Combine flour and baking soda; gradually add to sugar mixture. Beat in butter mixture until blended. Stir in nuts. Pour into a greased $15" \times 10" \times 1"$ baking pan. Bake at 350 degrees for 18 to 22 minutes or until a toothpick inserted near the center comes out clean. Cool on a wire rack.

Frosting

1 - 8 oz. package cream cheese, softened
1/2 c. butter, softened
3 1/2 c. confectioners' sugar

In a large bowl, beat cream cheese and butter until light and fluffy. Beat in vanilla. Gradually add confectioners' sugar until smooth. Spread over bars. Store in the refrigerator. Yield: 3 dozen.
