Women who Dare. Rachel Carson (1907-1964), environmentalist, author by Julie Bradley, editor

The youngest of three children, Rachel Carson had a rugged upbringing in a simple farmhouse outside the western Pennsylvania river town of Springdale. She credited her mother with introducing her to the world of nature that became her lifelong passion.

After completing her education, Carson joined the U. S. Bureau of Fisheries as the writer of a radio show entitled "Romance Under the Waters," in which she was able to explore life under the seas and bring it to listeners. In 1936, after being the first woman to take and pass the civil service test, the Bureau of Fisheries hired her as a full-time

junior biologist, and over the next 15 years, she rose in the ranks until she was the chief editor of all publications for the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service.

During the 1940s, Carson began to write books on her observations of life under the sea, a world as yet unknown to the majority of people. She resigned from her government position in 1952 in order to devote all her time to writing. The idea for her most famous book, Silent Spring, emerged, and she began writing it in 1957. It was published in 1962, and influenced President Kennedy, who had read it, to call for testing of the chemicals mentioned in the book. Carson has been called the mother of the modern environmental movement.

1988-1990	Production, Processing and Market- ing of Rootcrops project in coop- eration with UNIFEM in the Phillip- pines increased the income of 200 rural women and their families
1988-1990	Women's Agricultural Cooperative project in cooperation with UNIFEM in Brazil assisted 800 participants through the establishment of agricultural cooperatives.
1988-1990	Assistance to the Strengthening of Women's Association for National Development (WAND) in cooperation with UNIFEM in Sierre Leone initially provided support to women's organizations and encouraged their participation in women's and development issues.
1988-1990	"Women, Water Supply and Sanitation" Workshop in cooperation with INSTRAW held in Nigeria focused on involving women for efficiently in all aspects of water supply and sanitation projects.
1988-1990	Textile Production Projects in cooperation with UNICEF in Guatemala supported the purchase of equipment and materials and the training of women to improve textile production, nutrition, gardening, and food conservation.
1988-1990	Young Mothers Hostel Project in cooperation with UNESCO in Uruguay provided equipment for a workshop that annually provided five young mothers with job skills training.
1988-1990	Technical Training and Introduction of Appropriate Agricultural Technology to Increase Women's Productivity project in cooperation with UNIFEM in Mexico decreased women's household work load by introducing technology, such as water pumps, to provide additional time for

income producing activities.
