

Zonta Club of Denver General Meeting Minutes May 12th

Meeting was called to order at 6:04 p.m.

Invocation was provided by Linda McBurney.

Zonta Moment was presented by Minnie Lundburg who updated the club on our foster child Jeni Mponda from Malawi. We have had Jeni as our foster child for the past 6 years. She is in 5th grade. Malawi is in South Africa.

Guest included Jan Mitchell, guest of Dolores Lowery and our speaker Ron Ausmus from Heifer Project International.

Program was presented by Ron Ausmus who gave an overview of Heifer International. The organization prefers to work with families in various countries with a mean income of \$300-1,200 per year. Programs include women in livestock and the WILD women program.

April minutes were approved as printed in the Smoke Signal.

Treasurer's Report: Judy Allen reported that all but 2 members have renewed their memberships. Judy reported that we have received 2 checks for phones,. \$77 and \$24 respectively. Preparations are being made for the audit in June.

Also, Denver Kids awards ceremony is May 26th. We will be once again providing sandwiches, chips, grapes, cookies & drinks—please sign up! The Inter-district Membership meeting is being held June 24th—26th and there are sign up sheets on the clipboard for registration, nametags, preparation needs, etc. Sheila also reported that the Teen Mom graduation party went very well with 7 girls attending along with 21 Zontians. The girls raved on the way home about the wonderful party. The committee is working on long-term goals and projects

 Nancy Koontz made a motion to accept the standing rules as presented and recommended by the board. Sandra Stemmler seconded the motion and the motion carried.
- It was pointed out by Judy Allen that International has asked that printed matter reflect the word 'chairman' instead of 'chair'. Judy made a motion that the standing rules and by-laws be changed to reflect the 'chairman' vs 'chair' in every spot that the words were referenced. Linda Rhea seconded the motion and the motion carried with two opposition votes.
- It was noted that a great vote of thanks should go to Judy McNerny, Judy Allen, Jacki Sammons and Mary Benoit for all their hard work on the Standing Rules and By-Laws.

New Business:

 Installation of new officers was done by Past Governor Mary Benoit. The ceremony included honoring the 2004-2005 board, past Governors, Past Presidents, Members, current and future (guests) and new officers with yellow roses embossed with the Zonta International Logo.
