#### **IMAGINATION LIBRARY UPDATE**

It's been a bit more than a year since our club approved the Imagination Library Project. As is the case with any new project, sometimes they get off to a slower start than those of us involved would have liked. We were honored to partner with the Mayor's Office for Education and Children and specifically the Head Start programs in the 80205 zip code, which includes Five Points. We started enrolling kids in August of 2005 but the first books didn't actually go out until December.

- Of the 350 kids in the Head Start programs 275 were enrolled.
- Of the 275 enrolled kids, 90 will turn five by September and because the books only go to age five, those kids will not receive additional books.
- The remaining 185 children will continue to receive books through December, 2006, so that they will have a full year of books.
- We have a modest start to our fund raising efforts. Nine children have been enrolled by proud aunts or grandparents. Of the \$40 per child in this category, \$13 is pure profit as the cost of the books is \$27 per year. We've raised \$117 through this endeavor.

In addition, we've had \$81 in pure donations for our cause.

We are in the process of evaluating the project with the Administrator of the Head Start Programs.

If you have a niece or nephew, a grandchild, or know of an individual who would like to participate in the program, a copy of the application is included in this Smoke Signal.

Our committee has truly enjoyed this project and fully believe that education, of both boys and girls, helps improve the status of women by enhancing the chance for the girl child to improve her earning ability and economic status above the level achieved by her parents. Better educated boys will help their family members, be they wives or children, to reach for more.

## Zonta Club of Denver General Meeting Minutes May 11, 2006

The meeting was called to order at 6:05pm.

Invocation: Julie Bradley provided the invocation.

**Guests:** Sheila Davis's guests were her husband and daughter Steve and Laura Davis, and her sister Jan Banta. Nancy Long's guest was Renée Troppe from Zonta Club of the Pikes Peak Area.

**Program:** Kendra Brooks, Director of Development at Metropolitan State College thanked club members for the April 26<sup>th</sup> check of \$31,163 to the Zonta scholarship fund and for previous gifts. She noted that Metro granted scholarships totaling over \$1.2 million to 520 students, but had over 2,000 applicants, so the need is great. Metro currently enrolls a large number of single parents and the highest number of first generation college students in the state. Twenty-four percent of the students are minorities, also the highest in the state.

**Bylaws:** Judy McNerny reviewed bylaws changes proposed by the 2005-2006 Zonta International Bylaws and Resolutions Committee. There was discussion on two items that would change employment requirements for new members, who currently must be actively engaged in a decision-making position. Judy Allen made a motion that the club accept items numbered 16 and 17, which would allow new members who have experience but are not actively engaged. The motion was seconded and passed. Proposed changes will be voted on at the June convention in Melbourne Australia.

Minutes: April minutes were approved with the corrected spelling of Mirna Villalobos' first name.

**Treasurer:** Judy Allen asked that all requests for reimbursement of expenses be turn in to her by May 15th. She should have financial statement by next month.

**Service/Status of Women:** Beth Mundell thanked those who participated in a successful graduation party for the teen moms. Day of Caring is Saturday, May 13<sup>th</sup>. All Zonta volunteers will be seated at the luncheon. The club will serve punch and cookies at the upcoming Denver Kids Achievement Awards.

**Membership:** June's general meeting will feature a salad buffet and surprise program. The committee welcomes ideas about attracting new members.

**Fundraising:** Sheila Davis gave a reminder about the garage sale, including setup on May 19th and sale on the 20th. Sales at the Area 3 meeting in April generated \$185. A total of \$6100 has been raised in 2005-06. Sheila thanked the committee for their hard work. Dottie Jenkins asked that aprons be turned in to her or purchased for \$10. The club has fabric to make more.

**Public Relations:** Pictures were taken at the April donation of scholarship money to Metro, and were distributed with a press release to approximately 15 publications.

Old Business: Julie Bradley and Cathy Conley presided at the induction of new member Nancy Long.

**New Business:** Dorothy Swindt, assisted by Minnie Lundberg, conducted the installation of Officers, Directors and the Nominating Committee for 2006-07. She thanked the outgoing Officers, Directors and Nominating Committee for their service. Judy McNerny encouraged discussion about diversity in the club and a focus on inclusiveness in recruiting new members.
