President Beth's June Message

"Most people don't have any idea about all the complicated life going on inside a hive. Bees have a secret life we don't know anything about" - Secret Life of Bees, Sue Monk Kidd

I've thought a lot about bees recently; they are disappearing at an alarming rate. Thirty years ago, there were nearly 4 million bee colonies in the U.S. Today, fewer than 2.5 million remain. Without bee pollination American

crops can experience up to an 83% drop in production....83 percent! Think of the foods we enjoy...imagine how those will be impacted.

One day driving to work, I noticed a bumper-sticker that said, "Save the Hive". Instead of pondering the poor bees, I found myself thinking about our Zonta club, and the resemblance was meaningful. We all work independently in our lives, with families, our employment, but we all buzz back to our club to pollinate more ideas to meet the Zonta Mission, and in turn, receive nourishment that supports us going back into our communities to do more work. I was not around years ago when we had upwards to a 100 members in ZCD, but is seems that our "ZHive" needs our support.




