
ZONTA CLUB OF DENVER "ADOPTS" AIDS ORPHAN

Crossroads
Springs
Institute (CSI),

an orphan care center and school funded by Crossroads Springs Africa. Inc.

CSI provides support to children in the Hamisi, Kenya, area who have lost one or both parents to HIV/AIDS.

Crossroads Springs Africa was the dream of its founder, the late Dr. Meshack Isiaho, one he made a reality for the orphan children of his village. Dr. Isiaho's work is carried on by his wife, Helen Isiaho, who says, "Our vision is to provide health, nutrition, careful handling, and good education to the children so that they become happy learners, develop skills to support themselves and help others, and



become a source of economic and leadership strength for Kenya."

Crossroads Springs
Africa works through
networking alliances
with other
stakeholders to help
the children grow into
self-reliant,
responsible adults.

The ZCD sponsorship funds will go to the Crossroads education fund—for food, clothing, education and loving care provided by the local community.

The Institute has 367 girls and boys from early childhood development through grade eight. Several CSI graduates are in a secondary school.

Some of the projects the Institute

accomplished last year were:

- building a well for water near the school
- beginning construction of the girls' dormitory
- growing the library with donated books and three computers—the library now has tables and shelves!
- the poultry project is self-supporting

"In India's Hindu culture, women who become widows lose their 'auspiciousness'."

Advocacy

"Auspiciousness"

Dictionaries define it as "attended by favorable circumstances - marked by success - prosperous fortunate." I recently became intrigued with the word when I read a book in which the author talked about the "auspiciousness" of women - specifically the lack thereof. He was discussing women in India who found themselves widows - often at a very young age. When that happens, the author says,

women in that Hindu society lose their "auspiciousness." In times past, these women often chose to join their husbands on the funeral pyre, a practice known as Suttee. The word derives from the Hindu goddess Sati, wife of the god Shiva who immolated herself after her father insulted her husband, and the word "Sati" has evolved to mean "good woman" or "chaste wife." Greeks believed the practice had been adopted

discourage young wives from poisoning their older husbands.

Under British rule, Suttee in India was outlawed in the last century, but reports of the practice continued. Unfortunately, outlawing Suttee did not change the "status" of these widows – they simply went to live in hovels in the back alleys,

where apparently large numbers of them reside to this day. The most recent account of Suttee occurred in 1987 when an 18 year old woman joined her husband in death by fire. Opinions were split – half the country applauded her actions, but the other half contended that the girl, Roop Kanwar, was murdered. If it is true that widows are still not considered "attended by favorable circumstances" by their families and communities, then it is not hard to believe a young woman would choose a quick death over lingering poverty. Perhaps some Zonta "edutainment" would be useful in

changing people's minds about women's "auspiciousness" in India! During the past year your **Advocacy Committee** wrote articles about Advocacy and tried to keep you updated as to legislative matters concerning women. We featured two speakers at our March meeting – Amy Blackwell and Chaer Robert - and we collected your loose change at club meetings for UNICEF.

During the upcoming year, we will write about Advocacy efforts in Denver and around the world. Realizing that the ZCD is bipartisan while believing that Zontians need to hear

all available information in order to make educated decisions about the issues at hand, we will keep you informed about Colorado legislative matters. We will be supporting the new Area 3 "Zonta Says No" campaign for the 16 days of nonviolence in November, 2013, and we will be collaborating on advocacy with other agencies, like AAUW and the Women's Lobby. We will also be endeavoring to guide you into "everyday advocacy" through articles like the one above about women in India, because every woman on planet Earth deserves to feel "auspicious"!

AREA 3 PLANS ZONTA SAYS NO EVENT

Area 3 of Zonta District 12, headed by Mary Benoit and Area 3 director Debbie Squires, is beginning to plan a *Zonta Says No* event to be held the evening of November 25, the first of the 16 Days of Activism against Gender Violence.

Recent reports of violence against women have shocked the world, including the brutal rapes of young girls in India, and the rescue of three Cleveland women held captive for years, and used as sexual slaves.

Zonta International
President Lynn McKenzie
recently reminded
Zontians that, although it's
hard to feel that you can
make a difference
individually, everyone's
actions do make a
difference, no matter how
small. She urges Zontians
to become the voice for
those women and girls
who, for whatever reason,

cannot be heard.

Put November 25 on your calendar and ask Mary how you can become a voice against violence.

The event will be one of many actions by Zonta clubs and districts around the world that month to illustrate the collective commitment of Zonta's nearly 30,000 members to preventing and ending violence against women and girls.


