Sahia (standing at far right) brews and sells a traditional beverage, raises sheep and bought two donkeys that she rents to farmers who need to haul heavy loads.

Azumi and her sister Ashiza have become adept goat- and sheep-raisers, while Rabi Bouta deals exclusively in sales of rice and beans.

Dijé sells vegetables and Rahamaou sells ground cassava, both rare and desired commodities in the marketplace.

And Halima (seated near center in white shawl) regularly travels by bus to a local town; where she buys cooking gear and brings it back for resale.

Recently, CARE field agent Hadjia Jermaine Hessou (standing, center) visits the group to introduce a new component to their meetings -learning how to prevent, find support for, understand, and advocate for health services to counter HIV/AIDS. Hadija's visit is just one component of the project funded by the Zonta International Foundation for the 2004-2006 Biennium. Across Niger, nearly 200,000 women are members of more than 6,000 Mata Masu Dubara groups in six of the country's seven departments (or states) an extensive allfemale network to begin reaching women infected and affected by HIV/AIDS.

ZONTIANS 85 You Should Know

In honor of Zonta International's 85th Anniversary, we will highlight 85 Zontians who have made vital contributions to Zonta, their communities and the world. Please read *The Zontian* magazine and visit this page frequently to learn about these memorable and influential women.



Mary Jenkins was the first president of the Confederation of Zonta Clubs from 1919-1921. A pioneer in the field of journalism, she became owner and president of the Syracuse

Mary Jenkins Zenta Club of Syracuse, New York, USA

president of the Syracuse Herald in 1903. Dedicated to civic service, she was a

founder of Camp Hillcrest, a home for undernourished, crippled and convalescent children, and the trustee of the Huntington Foundation, a club for working girls and women. In 1945, Jenkins received an honorary degree from Syracuse University from Chancellor William Tolley, who said of Mary, "Your sincerity of purpose, ideals, and service have made you an inspiration to all who know you."

Today, the Zonta International Foundation legacy program is named for Mary the Mary E. Jenkins 1919 Society now numbers 39 women and men who have notified the Foundation of their intention to provide for Zonta programs through their estate.
