
## Fund Raising Committee

### President Judy's March Message

This month we will take a break from figuring out how to become wise and tackle something more manageable—the future of the Zonta Club of Denver.



Elsewhere in this issue you will see the report of the Nominating Committee and you will find that the Committee was unable to identify a member willing to take on the job of President-Elect, with its accompanying commitment to move up to the presidency the following year.

In terms of the short-term issue, if the Nominating Committee made an incorrect assumption that you don't want the honor of serving as president-elect and president (or serving again) and didn't ask you, please let me, Beth, Nikki, Minnie or Cathy know! It is *okay* to nominate yourself!

Each member who was approached for and declined the position had a different reason for her response, I'm sure. I'm also sure that every reason given was true and completely valid. However, I suspect that the common factor underlying the negative answers was the idea that being president of our club is a huge undertaking that can't be combined with a job, family responsibilities, or other community involvements.

This is a problem that extends beyond the question of who will succeed Beth. If the president's job is that overwhelming, almost no member has the time for it. A member volunteering today to fill that spot on the 2009-2010 slate of officers is only a stopgap measure.

What are long-term solutions? (There is no one "right" answer in spite of what my teachers taught me in grade school.)

I'm going to share with you some of the ideas that have occurred to me so far, in brainstorming fashion,\* and challenge you to come up with others for discussion at the March meeting.

- 1. Shut down the club.
- Eliminate the president position. Let the committees do club business and have club officers take turns presiding at membership and board meetings.
- 3. Have co-presidents.
- 4. Eliminate term limits and appoint me president for life!
- 5. Free the president-elect from the obligation to chair a committee and instead make that position assistant to the president.
- 7. Merge our club with Denver II.

Maybe a variation or combination of some of these ideas would work.

Full disclosure requires admitting that being president is a big job. While I don't agree that it is an overwhelming job, I have concluded that the time has come to at least pare it down, somehow.

We can't afford to accept the way things are. We care deeply about Zonta and its mission. We are intelligent women. We are great problem-solvers (at least when it's someone else's problem!) Let's think outside the box and solve this one.

#### FROM SOUTHEAST DENVER:

The hotel will be on your right.

#### FROM I-70 EASTBOUND:

Take exit 278 Quebec St, and then take the Smith Road exit. Make the immediate next left on 40th Ave (Sandown Rd on map). It will be just before the railroad tracks. At the stop sign, go through the intersection, turn left past the Eagle Legacy Credit Union. The hotel will be on your right.



## **February Meeting Features Grants**

The February dinner meeting is near the top of the "favorite things" list for many Zonta Club of Denver members. It's when the annual grants are awarded and members see the results of their hard work at fundraising and some of the beneficiaries of their many service hours.

On February 12th, representatives from Denver Kids, Polaris Project Colorado and Empowerment Program's Chrysalis Project received a total of \$35,000 in grant funding.

Zonta Club of Denver gave the Polaris Project \$20,000 for its work combating human trafficking. The grant funds will support the development of a community assessment tool that coordinates contact information for Denver Metro resources.

Polaris Project is an international non-profit organization that battles human trafficking and modern-day slavery, and strengthens the anti-trafficking movement through victim identification, advocacy, student and public training programs and legislator education, among other efforts.

Zonta Club of Denver awarded Empowerment Program's Chrysalis Project \$10,000 to support housing for women using the program.

Empowerment Program's Chrysalis Project is a public/private partnership with Denver County Courts and Denver City Attorney's Office that works to improve the lives of women who are, or were involved in street level prostitution. These women wishing to "leave the life" may opt for drug treatment, mental health and trauma treatment, training and employment services
