


PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE


ZCD Expanding our Audience and Our Perspectives

No Missed Opportunities






Zonta's Day of Film 2012:

Dear Kathy:

On behalf of the Board of Directors, staff and participants at Project WISE, it is my pleasure to express our gratitude to the Zonta Club of Denver for the 2012 \$10,000 grant to permit us to expand our Women's Leadership Program this year. Project WISE is a non-profit organization under 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code; no goods or services were provided in exchange for your donation. Its full value is tax deductible to the extent of the law.

As you can imagine, we're excited for the year ahead. Already compiling our annual outcomes for 2011, we can tell you that in 2011 we had 195 referrals for individual counseling and job coaching at Project WISE. Demand for our services is up tremendously over the past few years. Over 50% of these women engaged in 3 or more sessions with us. Fifty percent reported that they increased their economic self-sufficiency as a result of participation in our programming, despite the prolonged recession. We're pleased to have connected six of our participants with volunteers in our community in our Wise Woman Network mentoring program in 2011. 2012 is off to a fast start with already one new pairing established in January.

It is because of generous new supporters like the Zonta Club of Denver that Project WISE is able to make the difference we do among very low income women in the metro area. Many thanks once again for this philanthropic support of Project WISE. This vote of confidence in the part we play in the continuum of economic self-sufficiency programs for disadvantaged women in Denver is heart-warming. I would also like to thank you for the warm welcome you all gave Project WISE board member Melissa Chaffin and myself this past Thursday evening at your February meeting. We were both touched by your collective spirit and kindness. I look forward to seeing you hopefully at the March 10 Saving Face film event to benefit Zonta Club of Denver's Foundation.

The Many Faces of Advocacy

What are the many faces of advocacy? Of course many of us believe that advocacy means telling our elected officials to support or reject a certain piece of legislation. And that is one face of advocacy.

However, I will bet there are issues and concerns that we talk about daily without realizing we are advocating and getting our point across to whomever will listen!

Recently I contacted Rocky Mountain PBS about a program they call Women and Girls Lead. After looking up the program, which is to deliver on the promise of equal access and opportunity for women and girls worldwide through a media initiative, I decide to give them a call about Zonta.

Another face of advocacy: Zonta will meet with PBS to discuss, and perhaps to work with PBS on, our mission to sustain and move women forward—advocating for what Zonta believes in and getting the word out.

I was contacted recently by the International Visitor Leadership Program., an organization working with the U.S. Department of State that brings civil servants and community leaders together from around the world to listen, learn, and share ideas of government and leadership.

While serving in the Colorado Legislature I hosted several groups for the program and

introduced them to state legislatures in our society.

My contact for the program called me because she remembered not only my legislation, but my passion on the issue of human trafficking.

Next week Zontian Betty Edwards and I will meet with a group visiting the United States to examine U.S. local, national and international efforts to combat trafficking in persons.

Still another face of advocacy, this time two faces: one, about human trafficking and the other, about Zonta and our work on that issue.

Let's remember that if we want a better world for our children and grandchildren, and for ourselves, we must begin to look at the different faces of advocacy!

Liz Cameron introduced Lori Peterson and Catherine Henry representing Work Options for Women (WOW) and presented a check to Kathleen for \$7,000.00.

WOW is in its 15th year and provides training in culinary skills to women. They have two restaurants and 46% of their funds are provided through their restaurants. Some of our grant money will provide on-line interactive training for the women in their program.

DOMESTIC DIVA

Million Dollar Cheese Cake

Filling

1 pint whipping cream

2 tablespoons gelatin (2-packges)

½ cup cold water

2 egg yolks

½ teaspoon salt

½ cup milk

1 cup sugar

1 pound small curd cottage cheese

2 egg whites

Crust

30 Graham crackers

1 cup melted butter

4 Tablespoons sugar

(Adjust as needed—up to ½ increase—for larger dish)

Topping

½ cup chopped walnuts

³/₄ to 1 cup reserved crust

<u>Crust</u>

Process Graham crackers in a food processor until finely crushed.

Mix in sugar and melted butter. Press mixture into a large Pyrex baking dish (9x13 or 10x15).

Bake @ 425 degrees for approximately 10 minutes. Set aside to cool.

Filling

Pour cold water in bowl & sprinkle gelatin in it; set aside.

Beat egg yolks slightly; add sugar, salt & milk. Cook mixture until thick as custard; then add gelatin to hot mixture and stir until dissolved. Cool at room temperature until mixture begins to thicken and is no longer hot. Add cottage cheese that has been strained through a sieve; add vanilla & beat all until light & fluffy. Whip egg

whites & whipping cream (separately) until stiff. Fold both into cooked mixture and then fold in drained pineapple.

Pour into previously baked crust. Sprinkle with topping ingredients.

Chill for at least 2 to 3 hours before serving.

This makes a very large and light cheese cake – perfect for crowds and special occasions as it takes every dish in the kitchen to make!


ZONTA IS INTERNATIONAL


