CONGRESS PASSES VIOLENCE AGAINST WOMEN ACT

On February 28, a Senate version of the Violence Against Women Act was passed by the House of Representatives. As the Associated Press reported, on Fox News, "The bill renews a 1994 law that has set the standard for how to protect women, and some men, from domestic abuse and prosecute abusers. Thursday's 286-138 vote came after House lawmakers rejected a more limited approach offered by Republicans."

The law had expired in 2011 and was not reauthorized. Some Republicans voiced objections to including in the Act protections for immigrants, members of the LGBT community, and Native Americans. However, perhaps in the wake of the 2012 elections, those concerns were set aside last week.

Women's rights activists, who advocated for reauthorization, including many Zonta members, are delighted.

The <u>Christian Science</u> <u>Monitor</u> recently reported that violence or abuse between husband and wife – or any two intimate partners – has been on

the wane in America, falling by an amazing 64 percent between 1994 and 2010. These statistics are based on a recent report by the US Department of Justice on intimate partner violence. (The decrease mirrors the overall drop in violent crime during the same time period.)

Although there is not unanimous agreement that VAWA was responsible for the decline, some believe the law has been an important factor. The Monitor article states, "Many in the field cite a broad shift in attitudes that began in the 1980s and '90s, crediting public awareness campaigns, national legislation protecting victims, and subsequent training of police and prosecutors to recognize intimate partner violence as a crime, rather than as a private matter."

The news about violence against women and girls

remains grim in some other parts of the world.

The December gang rape and subsequent death of a young Indian woman has seemingly led to scrutiny in India of its

attitude about and legal treatment of such crimes.

In early February a seventeen-year-old South African woman was also brutally gang raped and attacked. She died from horrifying injuries but news reports indicate that violence, including violence against women, is so prevalent in South Africa that even this appalling crime failed to arouse a public outcry.

It is possible to change public attitudes about particular behaviors consider the change in views about drunk driving in the United States.

Change won't be easy or come quickly, but change is a certainty in human experience.

The incidents in India and South Africa highlight the importance of the UN Secretary-**General's** UNITE to End Violence against Women campaign, coordinated by UN Women, and Zonta **International's launch of** "Zonta Says NO."



It was a very blustery snowy day, February 21st, when many individuals interested in the issue of human trafficking came together at our state capitol. The event was organized and sponsored by The Human Trafficking Task Force of Southern Colorado. The weather didn't deter the


folks from the Springs and areas further south.

In the rotunda of the capital were very impressive displays and slide shows educating the public about human trafficking. iEmpathize and Truckers Against Trafficking put on the majority of the displays.

The day started with an overview of human trafficking in

presented this program. Next on the agenda was the a Human Trafficking Resolution presented to both the House and Senate. I had the honor and privilege of sitting with my dear friend and mentor Betty Edwards on the floor of both the House and Senate while the resolution was read. We heard testimony from several senators and representatives about how human trafficking has impacted them and their districts. The members of the H T Task Force were

introduced. Betty Edwards was introduced as the founder and driving force behind the Task Force. These dedicated advocates were met with enthusiasm and a lot of applause.

After lunch there was a very impressive panel addressing the many facets and issues surrounding human trafficking. Believe me it is a multi-layered issue. The final event of the day was a rally. The rally was supposed to be on the west steps of the Capital but given the nasty weather conditions we were moved inside. The move didn't curb the enthusiasm of the crowd. Everyone became inspired while staying warm. There was music, speakers, more literature, balloons and a lot of

excitement. In attendance were Attorney General John Suthers, Denver Police Chief Robert White, and dignitaries too numerous to mention. I came away with renewed dedication to the issue of human trafficking, as I am sure a lot of the attendees did.

FEBUARY MEETING MINUTES

The regular monthly meeting was called to order by President Wendy Moraskie at 6:05 pm with 34 attending. Four guests were introduced. Debbie Squires, Area Director, introduced the new Area 3 banner and new branding.

Laurie Peterson gave the invocation. The January minutes were approved with correction.

After dinner, Wendy introduced the members of the Service Committee who introduced the Program, the five organizations receiving our 2013 Grants:

Evie Ashmore introduced Open Door Ministries and presented a check for \$3500. Ashley Roberts and Barbi Stanfield talked about the 15 programs that Open Door operates. Our grant will go to books, school supplies, bus passes and more for the formerly homeless women in their program.

Nancy McWhirter presented a check for \$5000 to The Delores Project. Laurel Ramore and Terrell Curtis talked about Steps to Stability, their program that helps residents get their GED, offers supportive and sobriety services and housing resources. This includes an individualized plan for each of the 80 women who went through the program last year. Jeanette Newville and Liz Cameron presented a check for \$7000 to Girls Inc. representatives Melissa Flores and Jeslin

Shazarahan. The Zonta grant will help fund the STEM (Science, tech, engineering, math) after school program for girls. They hope to have a satellite location in Green Valley

Ranch.

WOW received \$7000 from Sue Kruger for their new program Kitchen Math. It will help the clients, (many of whom have a poor math background), deal with fractions and other math concepts related to cooking and measuring. The book they will use is called "Gallon Girl".

Jeanette introduced Bill Wynn and Stephanie Robinson from Friends of the Haven. Their grant of \$7000 will be used for computers and training certification in Microsoft Office for up to 20 women in their residential program for women with addictions. Many of the women in the 18 month program at the Haven come to them from jail and prison, and they must have a GED and employment to graduate from their program.


So, thank you for joining with me in Zonta's work and our Day of Film, to raise funds to give other women, very much like us except for an element or two, a second chance. See you at the theatre!


