I find it very fortuitous that as I am preparing to go to the 63rd session of the CSW in New York I am writing an advocacy article. I hope you will read it, here.



Learning Opportunity and FUNdraiser

Gain a Greater Understanding of Yourself and Others With the MBTI

Please consider joining me for a fun and informative workshop on the Myers-Briggs Type Indicator ("MBTI"), a tool I use frequently with coaching clients and work groups. The purpose of the MBTI is to make Carl Jung's theory of psychological types understandable and useful in people's lives. The essence of the theory is that much seemingly random variation in behavior among people is actually quite orderly and consistent, often due to basic preferences in the ways we take in and process information.

The workshop will take place on a Saturday morning, a Saturday afternoon, or a Thursday evening during March or April, and will last two hours. Here is the process:

- 1. Let me know if you'd be interested in participating by emailing me at marian.lee@comcast.net by **Monday, March 11th**.
- 2. I'll send around a poll to all the people who have expressed interest, so we can find the best date and time for the most people.
- 3. I'll send each attendee the instrument and answer sheet to complete and return to me, along with the registration fee of \$25.
- 4. I'll then prepare individualized reports for the attendees and design a workshop around the types of people attending. In addition to presenting an overview of type theory, we'll do some interactive exercises to better illustrate the type preferences at work.

All proceeds will be donated to our club's operating account. Hope to see you there!

February 14, 2019

CALL TO ORDER

President Marian called the meeting to order at 5:45

ADVOCACY MOMENT

Dawn Bali reviewed new bills coming up that we might support: Paid family leave; Full time Kindergarten; Human sexuality education; and renter's rights legislation are among them. Also, HB 1170 addresses resident's health and safety act. Leg.colorado.gov is online source for bills and current legis. Lobby day will be Feb 27th 8-11:30 Women's Foundation meeting on Mar 5th.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

<u>Fundraising</u>: Jeannette spoke about our Day of Film. Help selves to flyers on the table. Symphony in March tickets for \$35- Make checks out to Wendy but send to Cynthia. Next show is March 1st

Garage sale is May 18th – please bring items prior – large items/furniture on Friday evening.

Membership: Qtrly gatherings – fun outings in the summer. Guests are welcome to join our group.

GRANT AWARDS -

CJ lead presentation to introduce the Grant Recipients:

1st grant: Women Veterans Project to update their bridge homes. Theresa commented that our donations in November were greatly appreciated – the simple things have made a big difference

 2^{nd} grant - Asian Pacific Center. Pam introduced Director Lee: Self empowerment group for Domestic Violence. Have provided assistance for 39 years. The program Zonta is supporting is a 14 week DV group for immigrant / refugee women. "Safety is a Human Right"

3rd grant - Hope House. Mary introduced Lisa Stephens, executive director. Hope house houses 6 families, but supporting 240 teen moms to be self sufficient. Heavy focus on education. Early learning program for kids. Most have generational patterns that they are helping to break. 38 moms are now going to college through this program. 18% graduation rate from college – vs 2% nationally for this demographic. Gave example of woman who profited from the GED program

4th grant – Making Choices. Olette presented Amanda, executive director shared program – Flagship program pairing professionals as mentors and incarcerated women. MENTORS help women in a society that may not accept ex inmates back into society. Breaking the cycle of their own children from being incarcerated.

5th grant – Gwen introduced Karmen Carter, Executive Director of Blue Bench. Zonta grant will support the Safe Bars program. Karmen described their history of care for and prevention of sexual assault and that the safe bar programs will hopefully be 80% prevention. Karmen noted that Zonta was the first organization to sponsor this program

NEW BUSINESS

Jeannette spoke about a possible fundraiser event – A Myers Briggs workshop. Could include friends outside of Zonta. Marian will host the event on a Saturday in April for \$20. Proceeds go to the club.

PR – Wendy suggested inviting friends to our events. We have flyers and cards to take to associates

Evie – Dues are coming up and We will receive email reminders.

Zonta Rock – Penny gave it to Dawn Bali for her hard work on advocacy.

The Commission on the Status of Women (CSW) is the principal global intergovernmental body exclusively dedicated to the promotion of gender equality and the empowerment of women. It was established, as part of the UN's Economic and Social Council, in 1946. I find it very fortuitous that as I am preparing to go to the 63rd session of the CSW in New York I am writing an advocacy article.

The Commission works tirelessly with member states of the United Nations for gender equality and the empowerment of women and girls. It supports the implementation of the 1995 Beijing Declaration and Platform for Action, UN Security Resolution 1325, the UN Sustainable Development Goals (SDGS) and the Convention to Eliminate All Forms of Discrimination Against Women (CEDAW) and the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development.

Now I know all of that is more than any of us can wrap our brains around. The CSW program is just as mind-boggling. The events go on daily from early morning until way into the evenings. There are actually 400 events that will take place during the 2 weeks. The theme for this year is SOCIAL PROTECTION / PUBLIC SERVICES / INFRACTRUCTURE.

Zonta has a voice at CSW because we are an NGO (non-governmental organization) with consultative status at the United Nations. That is one of the many reasons it is such an honor to attend. A few of the events will be sponsored by Zonta. One of the most overarching themes of CSW is gender equality, something that is so important in our daily lives. Gender equality is the state in which access to rights or opportunities is unaffected by gender. This is not just a women's issue. This is an issue for everyone. Equality does not imply that men and women are the same but that they are of equal value and must be accorded equal treatment. When you look at gender equality from this point of view we quickly realize that this is an issue that affects our lives constantly. All of us must remain diligent. All of us must demand with dignity equal treatment.

So as we Zontians go to New York for CSW, I am sure we will learn things we never thought of. I am sure we will bring this newly acquired knowledge back to all of you. I know I have in the past and I am sure it will happen again. This year Nikki Headlee and Jeanette Scotland from our club are going. I am sure we will have lots to tell when we get home.

Advocacy Committee Report – January 2019

We had productive meetings with Wendy Moraskie, talking about public relations collaboration, and Sue Stark, from the League of Women Voters. The District 12 Centennial Anniversary Committee is marching on, to include lots of details of what other clubs are doing and the announcement of District 12 Governor Deedee Boysen's tour of the clubs. Our next committee meeting will be February 8th at the Burnt End BBQ restaurant: 5332 DTC Blvd #100, Greenwood Village. We hope to present a couple of ideas at the next Board of Directors meeting for approval, including how we may support the Women's Lobby of Colorado's Legislative Breakfast. Lastly, Advocacy will present at the March meeting, speaking about Child marriage within our district.

Wendy and Dawn spoke about CBS4's Week of Women as an opportunity to publicize the February awards dinner and the Day of Film. We brainstormed events and organizations that Advocacy could partner with in the future, such as Denver's Cherry Blossom Festival, galas, and summits. We look like we have great leads to follow up on!

At the Centennial virtual meetings, much discussion has occurred about how clubs will be celebrating the Centennial locally. Deedee has asked to be informed of these so that she may attend on her tour of the District's clubs. Advocacy will be deciding what our event will be, but Dawn is hoping for a parade!

Dawn met with Sue and Jeanette, discussing collaboration opportunities. At our next meeting, Advocacy will discuss potentially partnering with the League to support its *Women to Watch* event, March 24th and what that could entail. Sue invited Denver Zontians to attend future presentations, including a meeting February 19th at 5:30 pm where Colorado's demographer will likely discuss the upcoming census. Overall, it was a good informative beginning.

We received an invitation again this year to participate in the Colorado Women's Legislative Breakfast on Feb. 26th. In the past we've participated at the Supporter Level entitling us to table space for displaying Zonta information and two tickets to the event. Mary Lou Edwards and Carol Mangold attended this event last year and other members of our club have attended in prior years. The event is well attended by a broad scope of organizations and individuals. The program is informative and relevant.

February 2019 Advocacy Committee Report

The Advocacy Committee met on February 8th. The following items were discussed:

- Centennial Anniversary grant submission: The Haven was nominated by the Service Committee and CJ Long has taken charge of the submission process. Thank you so much, CJ!
- Centennial Anniversary Project: We are exploring participating in the Veteran's Day Parade on November 8th. Dawn opened discussion with Theresa Blumberg—Women Veterans of Colorado, hoping to partner with them. Doing so would reduce our entrance fee to \$0. The parade is divided by eras and Dawn hopes to enter the club in the WWI time frame. This would allow us to highlight Zonta's 100 years and women's suffrage in Colorado, which also is celebrating 100 years. Amazon sells suffragette costumes for less than \$30. It would be fun to march as suffragettes! If you are interested in helping in any way, please let us know. We also talked about partnering with ZCD II to work on a proclamation from the Governor's office and/or drawing awareness by shining an orange light on the Capital building.
- Dawn will give a presentation on the status of Child Marriage in District 12 at the March 14th Monthly Meeting.
- The Board voted to donate up to 30 Zonta pouches to support of the League of Women Voters event: Women to Watch. This event recognizes women who have overcome substantial hurdles. It is a simple punch and cookies reception on March 24. For more information, please contact Jeanette Scotland.
- Dawn attended advocacy training with the Women's Lobby of Colorado on 13 Feb. It was filled with lots of useful information, including what their priorities will be this session.
