

### RONALD MCDONALD HOUSE DINNERS

The Ronald McDonald House in Denver provides a "home away from home" for families whose children are being treated at Children's Hospital. It's located at 1300 E. 21st Ave, Denver, CO 80203, just a couple of blocks from the hospital. Their phone number is 303-832-2667.



Families have individual hotel rooms for sleeping and relaxing, and there are two beautiful, very large kitchens and eating areas located on the 2nd and 3rd floors. Individuals can fix their own meals, or be served by volunteer organizations such as ours.

The Zonta Club of Denver serves dinner for approximately 30-35 people in a buffet style format the third Monday of each month. Volunteers are asked to arrive at 5:30pm for set up, and serving begins at 6:00pm.

### The Gathering Place

Zonta is serving lunch at the Gathering Place on Wednesday, May 26th. Nikki Headlee and Linda Rhea have signed up to serve. .

### Day of Caring for Breast Cancer Awareness

This event will be held on Saturday, May 8th, at the Merchandise Mart, from 8am to 3pm. Its purpose is to provide education, empowerment, and hope to all women and men interested in this disease. There will be seminars, exhibits, a silent auction and boutique, and a luncheon/fashion show. Over 1000 people are expected to attend.

Day of Caring was a service grant recipient of our club this year, and we are one of their key sponsors. With our money, a resource center, Sense of Security, will be set up to provide non-medical financial assistance to breast cancer patients in Colorado. Some of the resource tables in the center will include the Food Stamp Program, the Low-income Energy Assistance Program (LEAP), and the Consumer Credit Counseling Service. Hopefully some of our members will be able to attend this wonderful event!

Please describe briefly highlights from the year, important committee activities including local pro-

### jects, public relations activities and work on advancing the status of women:

Every year since 1988, the Zonta Club of Denver has funded several scholarships to Metro State a local University in Denver. In June 2003, our club initiated an endowed scholarship with a gift of more than \$29,000. This was made possible from the provisions in the will of Edna Jean Hershey a member of our club from 1935 until her death in 1977. As a result of this gift, the Zonta Club of Denver was highlighted in the "Metropolis" Alumni magazine from Metro State. This gave our Club community recognition as it is sent to over 29,000 alumni.

In addition, the club annually sends out a reminder to all Colorado Clubs advising them of the provisions of the will of Edna Jean Hershey that makes funds available to needy Zontians. This follows established criteria as a result of Edna Jean Hershey's wishes.

On May 8, the Zonta Club of Denver participated in a Day of Caring for Breast Cancer. This was noteworthy in that this allowed our club to participate in a service project improving the status of women but also to see firsthand how are service grant dollars are being used. The Day of Caring was a grant recipient winner this year. Nine volunteers from the Club volunteered for this service project. Because of our sponsorship of this event, we received a  $\frac{1}{2}$  page ad in all programs as well as signage on all publications generated from this event.

We awarded a scholarship to our Young Women in Public Affairs - Bobby Jo Wessels, from Mullen High School. She was awarded the scholarship at our April 8, 2004 meeting. Her application has been forwarded to the District level for further competition.

The Zonta Club of Denver is a well-known entity at the Family Pathways events, Ringing the Bells for the Salvation Army, Santa Claus Shop and Dress for Success. We consistently display the Zonta emblem at all events. We continue our sponsorship at the Denver Kids organization and they consistently display the emblem on all of their stationary and fund raising literature.

We continue to prepare and serve dinner at the Ronald McDonald House every month. The Zonta Club of Denver is well known there and most people who are not familiar with our organization ask about it when they see our name. There are many single women with children who need the service of Children's Hospital, and the Ronald McDonald House. We fill a need to keep them going through rough times by providing a home cooked meal and supportive conversation.

Our Club also serves lunch and provides Mother's Day bas-

kets for the Gathering Place. This is the only daytime shelter for women and children in Denver. Our participation helps women who are in the most desperate of circumstances and in need of a place to stay, good food and personal care products.

Our Membership Committee planned very informative meetings for our club. Some of the speakers for this year included a person from the Jeffco DA's office speaking on the Dangers of the Internet, RTDs FASTRACKS Progam of Light Rail and Commuter Rail and our May meeting included a program on Identity Theft from the Denver District Attorney's Office.

Our Fund Raiser for this year was the very successful "Afternoon at the Theater". This was held in June 2003 and we made over \$2,000 from selling tickets to CATS. We have also sold pin holders and Chef's aprons. These two items have proven successful.

Our Club has been very busy planning for our fund raiser for 2004. A formal Business Plan with recommendations was presented to the Club's membership in June 2003. The Plan was approved and activities undertaken to move the Club on to this new annual fundraiser - a Home Party Event. This event is planned for November 5 and 6, 2004 at the Tivoli Center in downtown Denver. It has been official named "Let's Party". Money will be raised from renting booth space to vendors, charging admission to the general public and club members selling our own items. We expect this event to be a success and will be our main emphasis this next year.

### Suggestions for Next Year:

- We plan to concentrate our efforts on our Home Party Event - "Let's Party".
- \* We need to set up an organized support system for our older members who no longer attend meetings on a regular basis to let them know they are not forgotten.
- \* Also, we need to finalize plans for a new members handbook that will be given to all new members in addition to a new member orientation.

I believe our Club had a very successful year in helping to improve the status of women.

### ZONTA CLUB OF DENVER GENERAL MEMBERSHIP MEETING APRIL 8, 2004

The meeting was called to order 6:15 PM by President Evie Ashmore. Invocation was given by Diane Twining.

Board members present: Sheila Davis, Kathy Hyzer, Cathy Conley, Judy Allen, Linda Rhea, Liz Cameron, and Diane Twining. Twenty-three members and five guests were present.

Introduction of guests - Bobbie Jo Wessel, Young Woman in Public Affairs Award Recipient, her parents, and Bill Sperry from the Transit Alliance.

Member Moment was given by Cynthia Herndon.

Program - Bill Sperry from the Transit Alliance gave a presentation on "FasTracks", and how it is intended to alleviate traffic congestion. Mr. Sperry discussed the proposed expansion of light rail, introduction of "commuter rail", which would be built along existing railroad tracks, and the addition of parking spaces at light rail stations. He explained proposed new bus route neighborhood "feeders" to RTD Park and Rides, and new "suburb to suburb" bus service. He mentioned a company which makes train cars for "commuter rails", is located in Fort Lupton, Colorado. "FasTracks" is being proposed because it is expected that 1,000,000 new people will move to the metro area in the next twenty years. He mentioned ridership on the Littleton light rail line is 70% over initial projections, and that TREX is within schedule and budget expectations.

Young Woman in Public Affairs - Bobbie Jo Wessel gave a thoughtful presentation. She is planning a career in elder law, and would like to focus on the needs of women in particular.

February Minutes - approved.

Treasurer's Report - given by Judy Allen. The Treasurer's report will be filed for auditing. Judy Allen will email the report quarterly to the club. Judy collected unpaid dues and distributed dues statements to members who've not already received one. Judy reported our commitment to Zonta International has been paid.

#### COMMITTEE REPORTS

- \* Membership: Cathy Conley reported twenty-three members and five guests were present. Next month's speaker will be on "Identity Theft". Colorado ranks 4<sup>th</sup> in the nation in this crime.
- \* <u>Service</u>: Sheila Davis reported on past events including Ronald McDonald dinner and "Chefs Up Front", held at Johnson and Wales University March 21, and for which Cathy Conley and Joetta Williams volunteered. Future volunteer events include the Gathering Place on April 26 and May 26. The Rape Assistance and Awareness Program, one of our grant recipients, is offering our club a free Personal Safety class on Wednesday, April 21, from 6 to 9 p.m.; to be held at Hope United Methodist Church. Linda Corsmitt has volunteered to coordinate this event. The Nine News Health Fair needs volunteers in the 3:30 to 6:30 p.m. slot on Sunday, April 18. "Day of Caring" for Breast Cancer is scheduled for May 8 at the Merchandise Mart. Linda Rhea has volunteered to host the Mother's Day basket assembly project at her house Saturday, May 1 at 9 a.m. Mandy Ziegler has volunteered to coordinate our participation in the Denver Kids Annual Awards Banquet Thursday May 20, and their golf tournament June 21. Mary Benoit mentioned the Family Pathways "High Tea" is at Hudson Gardens April 18, and needs silent auction donations. Douglas County Zonta Club is hosting a "Trivia Competition" May 1.
- \* Fundraising: Diane Twining reported her committee had come up with suggestions for our "Home Party Event" name: "Let's Party, "Party People", and "Party Forum". Diane asked for input from our group for the favorite name. "Let's Party" won out. Diane also sought input on vendor selection and pricing. After discussion, Mary Benoit moved that fees for vendors be charged in the rate structure of \$75 for "Early Bird" sign up by July 15, \$100 if signed up by September 1, and "Late Entry" fee of \$125. All consultants, or vendors, will be expected to donate goods in kind with retail value of at least \$25. Judy McNerny seconded the motion; motion passed. Pinholders are for sale after the meeting. The fundraising committee has listed volunteer positions, so be sure to sign up. If you cannot help on November 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup>, there are different jobs available at different times during the approaching months.
- \* Communications: No report as Julie Bradley was out of town.
- \* Status of Women: Presented with speaker.

#### UNFINISHED BUSINESS

Margaret Fomer gave the Past President's annual report. Margaret mentioned suggestions and improvements made in the areas of membership and service, the new prospective member notebook, and Amelia Earhart fellow. Margaret communicated a new service project suggestion; helping Denver Kids in conjunction with Denver Mayor Hickenlooper's Cole school project. After discussion, Nicki Headlee moved that we appoint an "ad hoc" committee to investigate Margaret's proposal, and gather more information for the club. Diane Twining seconded the motion; motion carried. Nicki Headlee, Kathy Hyzer, and Sheila Davis will be on the committee.

### **NEW BUSINESS**

Margaret Fomer, as chair of nominating committee, presented the slate of officers for election. Evie Ashmore called for a vote; unanimous in favor. The revised slate of officers was elected: President – Diane Twining; President Elect – Linda Rhea; Vice President – Sheila Davis; Secretary – Julie Bradley; Treasurer – July Allen; Directors for 2004–2005 – Kathy Hyzer and Linda Corsmitt; Directors for 2004–2006 – Linda McBurney and Nancy Bruner-Koontz.
