- Every year an estimated 4 million women and girls are bought and sold worldwide
- Today 7,000 women and girls will contract HIV/AIDS

By addressing the effect of these disparities, and raising the public's awareness of the problem, the Colorado Consumer Health Initiative is working to create equal access to vital care regardless of a patient's background. Our panelists will focus on health disparities among women, the GLBT community, communities of color, and rural communities.

The meeting was called to order at 6:10pm. President Elect Sheila Davis presided.

Invocation: Kathy Hyzer gave the invocation.

Guests: Myrna Villalobos was the guest of Nikki Headlee.

Program: Cathy Conley introduced speakers Melissa Nix and Alice West-Goers. Melissa is the Service Coordinator of the Tinansa Intercultural Service Learning Program. Alice is a Regis University student participating in the program. The women spoke about the academic and experiential learning aspects of Tinansa, which promotes the spirit of service locally, nationally, and internationally. The May 2006 immersion and service learning project will build a library at the Wesley Girls' School for grades K-8 in Ghana. Melissa and Alice also brought African items for sale.

- **Minutes:** February minutes were approved as printed in the Smoke Signal, with the correction of the spelling of Louise Frolich's last name.
- Service/Status of Women: Beth Mundell reported that the Denver Kids Teen Mom graduation party is scheduled for Saturday, May 6th at the Salvation Army building. Day of Caring for Breast Cancer Awareness is May 13th, with set-up help needed on the 12th. There will be a Service Committee meeting in early June.
- **Membership:** Julie Bradley noted that the Membership Committee plans to focus on recruiting new members over the summer, possibly with a picnic.
- **Fundraising:** Volunteers are needed for the garage sale to be held at Cynthia Herndon's on Saturday, May 20th, with set-up on the 19th. Sale items may be dropped off beginning May 1st; please call Cynthia to arrange a time. Sheila Davis asked that members wear their aprons when working at the garage sale. The club has voted to skip next year's fundraiser and instead will ask members to donate money. The Membership Committee will suggest donation guidelines in the fall.


