The Jane M. Klausman Women in Business Scholarships are awarded annually to women pursuing undergraduate or master's degrees in business management. The Scholarships were established in 1998 from a generous bequest to the Zonta International Foundation of more than \$500,000 by Jane M. Klausman, a member of the Zonta Club of Syracuse, New York, and the 1990-1995 Zonta International Parliamentarian.

A single woman who pursued a business career as a professional secretary, parliamentarian and entrepreneur, Jane was able to leave such a generous gift because of her hard work, wise savings and prudent investments. She was also able to enjoy a comfortable semi-retirement that allowed her to work on professional projects, travel and fully participate in Zonta at the club, district and international levels.

An internationally known and respected parliamentarian, Ms. Klausman wrote easy-to-use parliamentary procedure books that are in use throughout the world.

The Zonta Club of Denver is pleased to offer a Jane M. Klausman Women in Business Scholarship. The scholarship will be awarded to a woman undertaking business studies who has demonstrated outstanding potential in the field.

The club will award a scholarship of \$1,500 for the 2012-2013 academic year to the successful applicant. The club scholarship recipient also will be entered to win two scholarships totaling \$1,500 (\$500 from District 12 and \$1,000 from Zonta International) awarded at the District level, and one of 12 International scholarships in the amount of \$5,000 each. Any woman undertaking a business and/or business related program at an accredited university, college or institute, and who is in at least the second year of an undergraduate

DOMESTIC DIVA

German Potato Salad

With our current warm weather, can summer pot lucks and picnics be far behind? Here's a mayonnaise-free and safe potato salad that's perfect for traveling or home fare.

2 T. sugar	8 slices bacon, chopped
1 cucumber, peeled, seeded, quartered and cut into ¼ inch slices	1 onion, minced
1 cup white vinegar	¼ cup olive oil
½ t. dried dill	¼ cup coarse-grain mustard (such as Grey Poupon Country Dijon or Harvest Coarse Ground)
3 pounds small red potatoes, scrubbed and sliced ¼ inch thick	¼ cup chopped fresh parsley
	Salt and pepper

Prep cucumber: stir sugar, cucumber, ½ cup vinegar, dill and ½ teaspoon salt together in bowl; set aside while preparing potatoes.

Potatoes: Bring potatoes, remaining vinegar, 1 teaspoon salt and 8 cups water to boil in large pot. Reduce heat to medium and simmer until potatoes are just tender, 10-15 minutes. Drain potatoes and return to pot.

Dressing: fry bacon in large skillet over medium heat, stirring occasionally, until brown and crisp, 8 minutes. With slotted spoon, transfer bacon to paper towel-lined plate; pour off and discard all but 2 tablespoons bacon grease. Add onion and oil to skillet and cook, stirring occasionally, over medium heat until onion is softened and beginning to brown, about 4 minutes. Drain cucumbers and reserve juice. Whisk cucumber juice, mustard and 1 teaspoon pepper into skillet; bring to simmer. Pour dressing over warm potatoes, stir to combine and let sit until slightly cooled and potatoes have absorbed dressing, about 10 minutes.

Assemble: stir parsley, drained cucumbers & bacon into potatoes to combine. Season with salt and pepper. Transfer to serving bowl.

Salad can be refrigerated in air-tight container for 1 day. Bring to room temperature before serving.

Serves 8.

DIVA HINTS

Avoid cross contamination and messy counters by using rimmed baking sheets:

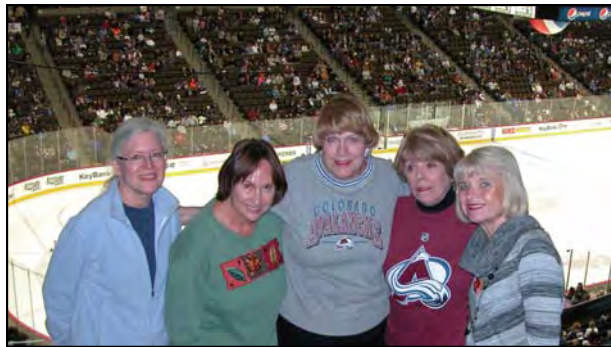
- When handling raw chicken, place the plastic wrapped chicken on a rimmed baking sheet. Cut the package open with kitchen shears, leaving the packaging, shears and any other dirty utensils on the sheet; pat the chicken dry on the baking sheet; then discard packing and place remaining utensils and sheet into the dishwasher or sink for cleaning.
- When cutting meat, chicken, fruits (like pineapple) or any other messy items; place the cutting board into a rimmed baking sheet. Any

juices will drain into the sheet, not onto your counter.

Rather than dirtying a colander to rinse and drain canned goods like bean and olives, try this:

- Hold the can upside down over the sink and make 3 small holes in the bottom with a church key or can opener.
- Turn the can right side up; set it over the clean drain in the sink and then open the top with a can opener.
- Liquid from the can will drain through the holes in the bottom. You can then rinse the contents right in the can.

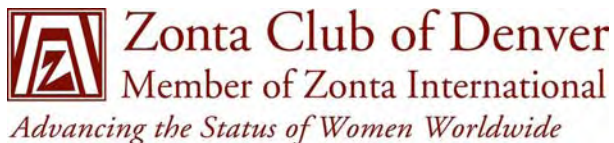
