College Campus Sexual Assault

In the aftermath of our Day of Film on March 5, featuring the film The Hunting Ground, I have been following media reports on reactions to the issue of sexual assault on college campuses.



There are numerous initiatives, the most prominent is the one introduced in September by President Obama called "It's On Us". Vice President Biden appeared recently in Boulder at the University of Colorado at an event to discuss this issue. Hundreds of students joined the Vice President in taking the Pledge:

"I pledge to recognize that non-consensual sex is sexual assault, to identify situations in which sexual assault may occur, and to create an environment in which sexual assault is unacceptable and survivors are supported."

Colleges and Universities all over the country have been forced to deal with this issue in a more forthright manner and make efforts to improve the current system. A big part of the training is bystander intervention. Students are being asked to take action if they see a situation that might escalate to sexual assault. students to only take a drink from a server or serve themselves - never let someone else hand them a drink.

There have been over 135 events in 35 states so far, including round table discussions, to collecting signatures and students "taking the pledge". The NCAA and at least 2 fraternities have signed on.

Last week, 3 Colorado students were honored at a White House event as "Champions of Change". The award honors leaders on different issues. This year the award focuses on students contributing to the effort to change college culture around sexual assault.

The book MISSOULA by Jon Krakauer is about sexual assaults at the University of Montana. This book shows that the issue does not seem to be gender specific. In this book, the "bad guys" were a female detective and female prosecutor. The "good guys" were a male dean, university President and a male Regent. The dean retired and the President and Regent lost their jobs because they took on a football player. Just last week, a student sued BYU in Utah, because the University cited her for a "morality" violation of the student code after she reported that she had been assaulted.

There is much work to be done, however. I am happy that our Day of Film this year put the spotlight on an issue that is finally being recognized in our country. At the Boulder event Senator Bennet stated: "College campuses should be safe, they should be a place where students learn and explore the world. Two-thirds of victim report it to you - to their roommates, their sorority sisters, to their friends...You've got to speak up...That's the character test you're going to have to pass. Another note:

According to a recent article in the New York Times, Colleges and Universities are spending millions to deal with sexual misconduct complaints, since the Federal Government added sexual misconduct to Title IX in 2011.

Some Universities, like Harvard, for example, have Title IX departments of more than 50 people. Because of the complexities, these kinds of cases have become wrenching for students, faculty and administrators. Title IX departments are working to set up codes of conduct for students ranging from "affirmative consent" to "unwelcome conduct".

This is certainly not the last that we will hear of this complicated issue.

Legislation Update: Do It Yourself!

I am writing this in mid-April and it is likely that if I reported on pending legislation, much of what I reported would have changed by the time you read this. So, instead, here is a brief primer on how to follow legislation by yourself.

The Colorado General Assembly has its own home page, at <u>www.leg.state.co.us.</u> From there, if you click on either "House 2016 Regular Session" or "Senate 2016 Regular

Session" and then "Bills and Fiscal Notes" you will find a page where you can search for a bill by the bill number (for House bills, HB16- followed by a four-digit number, as in HB16-1001 - with the 16 standing for 2016; for Senate bills, SB16- followed by a three-digit number, as in SB16-001), read the bill by clicking on the bill number in the first column, find out what's happened to it so far by clicking on "History," or get other information by looking around and clicking in different places.

You can also read through bill titles to try to identify bills that may affect women, which can be fascinating but is definitely time-consuming.

Alternatively, on the General Assembly home page click on "2016 Regular Session" and you can search for text, say, "trafficking." The search results will include all bills that include that term.

Probably most of you don't want to take that much trouble, so here is a shortcut. There are other organizations following bills that affect women and here are links to the websites of a few of them. I have used some of these in preparing legislation reports.
