> Do you support House Joint Resolution 35 that introduced the following Constitutional Amendment?


This joint resolution proposes a constitutional amendment declaring that women shall have equal rights in the United States and every place subject to its jurisdiction.

#### **General Meeting MINUTES**

March 14, 2019

#### CALL TO ORDER

President Marian called the meeting to order at 5:30

#### ADVOCACY MOMENT

Dawn presented article regarding what a feminist country looks like – Sweden. Policies that support women outlined.

#### **APPROVAL OF MINUTES**

February minutes were approved as published in Smoke Signal

#### SPEAKER

Dawn Bali talked about status of child marriage in District 12. First Dawn presented Advocacy committee 3-year forecast which includes the Z100 participation. We will participate in Veterans day parade dressed as suffragettes commemorating 100 years. 3<sup>rd</sup> year goals include getting more involved and drawing in the community to our club.

Drawing from research statistics – a compilation of three resources, Dawn summarized findings. Much more prevalent for younger girls to be married to older men. Not more prevalent in immigrant community. In areas that are less affluent – higher rates with African Americans. Two states, Delaware and NJ have outlawed underage marriages.

Wyoming .19% child marriage, Colorado has second highest %. Montana has lowest in our region. Idaho has the highest % of child marriage in the US. Dawn outlined the different laws per state.

There is a coalition to end child marriage now that includes many organizations. We might consider joining this coalition. Equality Now and Unchained At Last, who formed coalition, provided information.

MaryLou Edwards presiding

Meeting was called to order at ...5:35p

The speaker, Dan Steele, is an investigator and Vikki Migoya, Communications Director, with 18<sup>th</sup> judicial district

Police officer for 18 years – responsible for human trafficking (HT) for Arapahoe/Douglas Counties, previously in Denver

Innocence lost task force

- HT is about looking at vulnerable individuals. choice made for them!
- Child sex trafficking (what he looks at)
- Kids get tapped into online sites: Snapchat, Tagged, Bumble, etc.
- High risk victim model:
  - o Runaway
  - Where: locations of bad influence
  - Interacted with communities that were bad. Hanging around bad individuals – meet people who might normalize these types of actions: wrong crowd at school – skipping school etc.
- Have victim advocate, court appointed guardian *ad litem* 
  - Point in correct location for help
  - Put at risk so need to help interview those kids to help
- He reviews situations to see if domestic violence or HT etc.
- Focus on sex trafficking, children and domestic
- Where does it occur E Colfax, Truck stops, internet
- Customer dictates where it occurs
- Who are they: pimp, family members
- Commercial sex work....pro- and anti-legalization
- About 890 sex partners per year. always sexually assaulted no matter what
- Getting out of the life when they see the book of before and after. Photos.
- Documentary short: Disguises....8 minutes
- Average age 15 years...mostly girls but 90-10 girls to boys
- Success rate to recover children.
- Success rate not being involved in that lifestyle again. a lot of recidivism in that population: mental health drug, been trafficking Being sexually abused 10 times a night: fairly low percent going back to their trafficker if we don't intercede they are in love with their trafficker and they go back. When working with teenagers treat them as an adult be caring and empathetic and don't talk down to them.
- Is there an organization at the jail that will help kids intercede give them options. Don't arrest kids
- A lot of options for kids Extended Hands of Hope, Sarah's Home, Resilience Rising, Denver Street School's new program: Denver Hope Academy
- Recruitment on 16<sup>th</sup> street mall

Advocacy moment from Linda Rhea:

ProVoice, concept promoted by Aspen Baker, who had an abortion when she was 24. How to keep listening when the world wants to fight. Ted talk and book. 7 ways to be a better advocate for women. We are invested in our issues and not listening about their perspective

Barb Pellegren moved to accept the slate as nominated. The motion was approved.

#### Committee Reports

Jeanette: FR don't have all expenses in – should make \$12, 225. This was a club event. Nikki, Cathy, Kathy, Gwen, Sara, etc., pitched in. Talk to Cathy C to buy one of the centerpieces for \$5. Alexis helped and put us in touch with iEmpathize and the Skype interview was great—Norma was in Luxembourg! The sale of Symphony tickets has allowed Wendy to contribute \$524 into operation expenses. Carmina Burana is coming up. Garage Sale: on May 18<sup>th</sup>. Cabinets/desk from Linda - can we sell with a picture? Wendy will create a flier. 88 pouches left.

Membership – Veronica: We need new members. Contact friends to see if they want to join.

PR – Wendy: Use car stickers or a District 12 pin to get the word out about Zonta

Service – Mary: Book Project. Book drive for Denver Children's Home (DCH). She will collect books tonight and next month. Will take money as well. DCH is oldest 501(c)(3) in Colorado 12-18. Coffee shop to learn how to be baristas. Take books – If we can bring them during morning so they can sell coffee. DCH off Colfax & Colorado Blvd 1501 Albion. The director of education reports they have had no new books for the past 10-15 years.

Service Committee donations: Pam will take the diapers and wipes.

Other committee reports

Centennial Anniverary Committee: Plan to focus on veterans – march in parade etc.

Old business:

Nikki Headlee reported on the United Nations Commission on the Status of Women (CSW), part of the UN's Economic and Social Council, which Nikki attended this year for the first time. Zonta has consultancy status at the UN. Over 800 NGOs applied to present at the CSW, only 400+ were accepted. Zonta presented two "parallel" events (those held at venues near the UN) and one "side" event (those held at the UN). The Zonta presentation about Let Us Learn was wonderful. The presenter was born in Korea and became an orphan. She was adopted by an American family and went on to success. She wanted to do something with kids who would not otherwise be reached and, with her husband, donated \$20 Million to UN for Let us Learn. Let Us Learn Madagascar is one of the projects supported by ZI through the UN.

The events did not all highlight charity from the developed world to underdeveloped countries. Many NGOs attending the CSW are grass root NGOs in the target countries.

Other business.

We would like to extend more support to Helen Mulhern. Julie is coordinating visitors, so they don't duplicate efforts on the same day. Look for her Sign Up Genius email.

Announcements.

LorieDiSaia solicited contributions for her charity benefiting orphans in Kenya.

We will be at Fresh Fish Company next month.

Liz won the 50/50 and money was donated back to the club.
