Women's History by Julie Bradley, editor

Since it was founded in 1864, Statuary Hall in the Capitol Building has offered each state a chance to highlight two of their state's most important people. Due to legislation passed in 2000, states now have the opportunity to replace their statues. To date, only Kansas and Alabama are opting to change who they honor. Kansas is replacing both of its statues; one of the new selections will replace John James Ingalls with Kansas native Amelia Earhart. Alabama will replace the statue of Jabez Lamar Monroe Curry with one of Helen Keller.

Three states - New Mexico, Nevada, and North Dakota - currently only have one statue in the Hall. Two of these states have opted to choose a Native American woman as their second statue. Nevada's new statue will be of Sarah Winnemucca, who founded the first school for Native Americans in that state. North Dakota will honor Sacagawea, the guide and interpreter to the Lewis and Clark Expedition.

Mother Joseph - a nun and carpenter from the state of *Washington*




Dr. Florence Rena Sabin - noted scientist and pioneer in public health from *Colorado*



Frances Willard - a feminist and WCTU leader from *I Ilinois*.

....the United Nations has created special days to raise awareness and promote international action on issues that need immediate and on-going attention from governments, UN agencies and people everywhere:

- October 1st—International Day of Older Persons is an opportunity to support the needs of women over 60, a significant and growing segment of the world's population.
- October 10th—World Mental Health Day is an opportunity to promote mental health, a critical and often neglected area of women's health and an important aspect of violence against women.
- October 24th—International United Nations Day is an opportunity to engage your club members in new ways to increase club participation in Un sponsored activities to advance the status of women through both community action and international advocacy.
- 4. November 25th—International Day for the Elimination of Violence against Women is an opportunity to publicize your club's activities to combat violence against women as part of a powerful world-wide action designed to draw public attention to the continued violation of women's rights through acts of violence.
- 5. December 1st—World AI DS Day is an opportunity to take action on behalf of the millions of women and girls, the ever-increasing majority of those who suffer from HIV/AI DS, many of whom have been infected by acts of violence and violations of their human rights.
- 6. December 10th—I nternational Human Rights' Day is an opportunity to familiarize your members with human rights conventions such as CEDAW, analyze your own community for gender inequalities, and strategize on how to advocate to eliminate these inequalities.
- 7. March 8th—International Women's Day is an opportunity to add your individual and collective voices, in solidarity with women around the world, to efforts to promote individual rights and fundamental freedom for women and girls.

Through the integration of our commitment to the United Nation's sponsored initiatives for women, legislative awareness and advocacy on international, national, and local levels, and our global and local service projects, we can strengthen our work to advance the status of women throughout the world.

Zonta Club of Denver General Meeting—October 9, 2002

Call to Order—6:00 p.m. President Margaret Fomer called the meeting to order and gave the invocation.

Zonta Moment—Barbara Pellegren made a short presentation on the founding of the Zonta Club of Denver. The Zonta Club of Denver was chartered on March 11, 1927. It became part of the Confederation of Zonta Clubs founded in 1919. Denver was a small town in 1927 and the Zonta Club of Denver was the only club in the United States between Chicago and the west coast. Barbara related her own experience in becoming a Zonta member. The club consisted of 35 members and met at the Brown Palace Hotel. Since its inception, the Zonta Club of Denver has worked to promote and advance the status of women as well as helping to organize several clubs, from Kansas City to South Dakota.

Business Meeting

The minutes will be addressed at the next meeting. Nikki Headlee will have the budget at the next meeting.

Committee Reports

- * Membership—Kathy Hyzer reported on the member recruitment party at the King Foundation. She stressed the importance of recruiting more members and for all of us to participate in this.
- * Service—Linda Rhea presented several opportunities for volunteer work, Among them serving dinner at Ronald McDonald House and I ssachar, ringing bells for the Salvation Army at Park Meadows, and the Santa Claus shop (location chosen). She also mentioned the importance of keeping track of service hours and turning them in to her.
- * Fund-Raising— Diane Twining and her committee have decided on the bazaar name for 2003: "Zonta Club of Denver International Holiday Bazaar" October 10 & 11, 2003. The location is the Greek Orthodox Church on Alameda. Vendor applications were passed out. The show will be juried with a \$10 fee. Sub committees have been set up and members are needed. All members were asked to attend local craft shows to get ideas on shows and share them with the committee.
- * Communications—Julie Bradley talked about the member directory and the need to provide her information of work or home address, changes, etc. She also passed out changes to put in the directory
- * Status of Women—Evie Ashmore talked about the Amelia Earhart Scholarship as well as the applications for the Young Woman in Public Affairs which will be mailed out to schools shortly.

Unfinished business—Margaret Fomer talked about the results of the Retreat held earlier in the year. Each committee received suggestions from the retreat to implement to recruit and retain members. A trifold brochure is being published.

New Business and Announcements.

- * Margaret Fomer introduced Julie Bradley as our Zontian of the year. She praised Julie as someone who is always there to help especially with the Smoke Signal, someone who can be counted on to help and exemplifies what being a member of Zonta is all about.
- * Shari Dorton and Sheila Davis presented District 12 moments. Included were Zontians of the year; District 12 Governor—our own Mary Benoit; entertainment and hospitality by the Zonta Club of Cheyenne. Next year the District meeting will be held in Billings, Montana.
- * Liz Clinton presented a book for care giver recipients.
