

### What's New At Convention In 2004

#### Electronic Audience Voting

Instead of the lengthy and often frustrating manner of counting delegate votes for various issues, we will replace the green and red voting cards with electronic hand-held audience

voting devices. The electronic voting devices will be preloaded to reflect the number of votes each delegate holds, and allows for instantaneous counting at the push of a button. These vot-



ing devices will also considerably reduce the time required for elections. Careful training will be provided to ensure each Zonta voter will be comfortable with the process. The hours saved by using electronic audience voting will be dedicated to important program issues and add to available free time.

#### Online Registration

For the first time, Zontians will have the opportunity to register for the Convention online. This process will eliminate the lengthy process of mailing registration materials, allow the use of credit cards, and provide rapid feedback to each registrant.

The New York City Dine Around To allow Convention goers the opportunity to visit a



variety of New York City neighborhood restaurants and meet other Zontians from all over the world, we will offer the NYC Dine Around experience. During five evenings, Zontians can partake of an escorted group dinners in a traditional American, Soul Food,

Italian, Chinese, or Brazilian restaurant. Pick the cuisine that appeals to you or take advan-

tage of several different neighborhood restaurants over the course of the week. Transportation to and from each restaurant will be provided.

#### \* The Marketplace

Zonta shoppers will have the opportunity to purchase a wide variety of Zonta related items, sold by the Zonta Clubs of North America, in our extensive Marketplace. Only clubs, not individuals, will be allowed to sell products. Up to 250 tables of Zonta items will be displayed for your browsing enjoyment. The profits of these sale items, which will be used to support club activities and projects, can be used as speaker gifts, souvenirs, and presents for Zontians back home.

#### Open House

We are working to offer Open House hospitality from members of Zonta Clubs and Districts

all along the east coast of the United States. Opportunities for Open House visits will be available from



June 26<sup>th</sup> to July 2<sup>nd</sup>, before the Convention; and from July 9<sup>th</sup> to July 15<sup>th</sup> after the Convention. Home stay and breakfast are included in the Open House program, and visitors are expected to pay transportation costs. Enhanced international understanding and new friendships are free.

#### Two-Part Open Forum

Another innovation designed to save time and improve communication within our organization is a special two-part Open Forum. The first part of the Forum will be dedicated to the discussion of general issues, and will allow questions to be directed to various Zonta leaders. The second part of the Forum will be dedicated to bylaws issues. Zontians will have the opportunity to ask questions and make statements about proposed bylaws in an effort to enhance understanding and intent. Two hours will be set aside for this critical bylaws discussion, and should provide sufficient information to possibly curtail some of the bylaws discussion during the business sessions.

## District 12 Report from President Evie Ashmore:

The 52nd District 12 Annual Conference was held in Billings, Mt, Sept 26-28 at the Historic Northern Hotel.



Mary Benoit, District 12 Governor and our very own Club member did an outstanding job with her theme— "Dream the Dream— Share the Vision— Keep the Focus". 12 of our club members at-

tended—Evie Ashmore, Delegate, Diane Twining, Alternate, Sheila David, Judy Allen, Marjorie Pickett, Jacki Sammons, Julie Bradley, Dolores Lowery, Mary Benoit and Cynthia Herndon represented our club.

Dolores Poppler, Deputy Mayor welcomed us to Billings along with Lynn Eggebrecht, President of the Zonta Club of Billings. 81 Zontians attended the Conference. The first day dealt with the formalities of the conference and

a short presentation by B.J. Bourdon, our International Representative. She is from Massachusetts and a real delight to meet. I reported the number of delegates attending the conference—12 and the number of miles driven 12,650 miles as well as 39 paid members.



At 3:30 p.m. we broke into groups to attend Workshops— Membership, Fundraising presided over by Julie Bradley, Service & Potpourri.

#### Membership covered:

- \* What were the most and least successful membership recruitment efforts" Social Meetings for new members held at a nice location with guests invited. Hold an orientation meeting by invitation only.
- \* Where do you find new members? EVERYWHERE think Zonta
- \* What do you do to mentor new members? Assign a Zonta buddy, develop a description of duties.
- \* What do you do to retain members that have been in the club for a while? Get members involved with Area, District and International Meetings.

#### Service covered:

\* What are your most and least successful service projects? Ronald McDonald, collect food for food pantry, focus on organizations that meet the mission of Zonta

- \* How does your club decide service dollar donations and what method do you use in the presentations in order to receive community acknowledgement? Send out applications—place applications on web-site. Look for organizations that meet Zonta's mission and don't get a lot of other donations.
- \* How do you find hands on service projects and then get your members excited about the project? Bring in organizations to speak to members. Obtain activities through the members—obtain buy in.
- \* Do you evaluate your service projects as A and B Projects? Some clubs do. Projects that make us feel good are good and can be used as a recruitment tool—such as our Ronald McDonald project.
- \* Are there ways you could use service projects to recruit new members? Groups decided this was essential. If you lose focus, it is hard to recruit new members. Don't do too many projects!

#### Fund-Raising covered:

- \* What are your most and least successful fund raisers? Antique Show, Bake sale, sale of poinsettias and wreath sale, EXPO, Craft Show, sell tickets to an event were examples of successful efforts.
- \* How does you club choose fundraisers? Fund raising committee researches and ideas are accepted by members.
- \* Has your club ever calculated your profitability according to dollars raised compared to the hours spent? Most clubs have done this and make a decision as to whether to continue.
- \* If a fundraiser is not profitable do you consider it PR? Most clubs supported this.

#### Potpourri covered:

- Does your club have leadership training in place? Most clubs use existing members to train. Use resources of the CWLC.
- \* When is your club nominating committee elected and when do they start working? Most clubs elect a committee—some start work immediately, but others wait until two weeks before. Recommendation received was to do during the year by observing members.
- \* How does your club find scholarship recipients and promote both the YWPA and Klausman scholarships? Name is confusing. Work with school counselors and follow-up.
- \* How does your club celebrate UN day and Zonta Rose Day? Invite an International speaker, give roses to selected community leaders.
- \* How does your club handle the challenge of getting the Zonta word out? PSA's, press releases, members give a yellow rose to people who support the club—wear Zonta clothing at events.

We all learned some things to bring back to our clubs and

our Club was a hit with our tri-fold brochure Wendy designed for us. All of the clubs were anxious to obtain. Friday evening we attended Trivia Night at Yellowstone Art Museum. Some of us were lucky and won prizes. I was on a team named the Biker Babes and the Stud. You had to be there!

Saturday, I as your delegate reported our Service dollars:

We voted on the 2004-2006 Budget and reviewed the Financials for 2002-2004. We received a report from former Governor, Betty Edwards, Nominating Committee. Jacki Sammons reported on the Zonta International foundation in her role as Foundation Ambassador and Zonta International Foundation Director. She did a superb job! We saw a video of Zonta International President Margit

Webjorn and also heard a keynote presentation by Betty Jane Bourdon, Zonta International Vice President. We attended a luncheon and heard a very inspiring speech by Dr. Tasneem Khaleel, Professor at Montana State University in Billings. She was very interesting and shared with us some of her life experiences. She started school at 3 years of age!



We listened to a panel discussion on Z Club presented by the Zonta Club of Glendive. This is a very active club in a high school in Glendive. The President as well as the class advisor attended and answered questions. This is something we may want to pursue!



We listened to nominating speeches by those running for District 12 offices and Shelia Davis did a wonderful job on presenting Elizabeth Clinton who was running for the District Nomination

nating Committee. Guess what- she won! So did Julie Bradley as Vice Area 3 Director. We attended a lovely banquet and made Zontians of the Year Presentations. Janell Will, a former members of our club was named Zontian of the Year by the Douglas County Club. We, of course, presented our winner—Elizabeth Clinton.

Sunday brought the moving Memorial Service. District 12 lost 11 members last year including Maryethel Meyer and

Billie Smith. Marjorie presented a moving tribute to



Maryethel. Judy Allen honored Billie Smith. We enjoyed a buffet brunch and received two awards. The first was the Zonta International, District 12 Governor's Award for Membership—a very heavy bell. We had 12 members in attendance. We also received

- Uncooked roll mix (no pre-baked bread or refrigerated rolls)
- Cookies
- Cooked Pumpkin Pie (not frozen—no berry pies, only pumpkin)
- \* Jell-O Mix
- \* 1 cube Margarine/butter
- \* Party Mix
- \* Candy
- \* Aluminum Turkey roaster
- \* Ribbon to decorate basket

Canned goods can be brought to the November meeting or money to buy items. You can get turkey (two for one near Thanksgiving) or pies and deliver to Linda Rhea at her house on November 26th.

Anyone who wants to help assemble baskets at Linda's house in her sunroom on the 26th is welcome. Delivery day is Wednesday.
