### President Nikki's November Message...

October 29, 2007

How time does fly. Now it's Halloween; then before you know it, Thanksgiving; and before you know it Christmas and 2008 will be upon us. The way time flies, makes me feel that the District 12 Conference was ages ago, when in reality it was only a month ago. I felt it was one of the best, if not the best District Conference, that I had been to. If you were at the October meeting, you heard impressions from members who did attend. There are two items that should be reported on.

The first was the number of service hours our club reported. Our club reported only 262 hours for the time frame 6/1/06 through 5/31/07. Clubs that were smaller than us reported service hours over 1,000. There was lively discussion about this at our Board meeting. The consensus was that we are doing the hours but just not reporting them, which makes us look lame when we're really not. Your Board has some pretty creative individuals who have come up with a great visual idea for our awareness. It will be unveiled at the November 8 meeting. When counting hours for doing service, it's not just the hours at the event that count. For example, the Dolores Project dinner would include hours spent shopping for the food, preparing it, driving to and from the event, as well as the actual time spent at the event. Hours spent by the Imagination Library volunteers would include all the work to create the database and upkeep, opening and forwarding the enrollment cards, etc. The October dinner for the Teen Moms would include hours spent purchasing the Women's Bean Project products, time spent by those who prepared the dinner, as well

as time spent preparing the bags the girls took home. We will be coming out with written guidelines to help all of us accurately report our service hours. And, we're working on improving our tracking of those hours.



The second item is that District dues will be raised by \$13 per year. This amount will be included in our 2008/09 dues bill coming out in April. The dues have not been raised since 1995. Inflation has gone up each year since then. The costs to hold Board meetings has also increased each year. All members of the District Board are paying many expenses out of their own pockets when these should be covered by the budget. The cost to increase is a mere \$1.08 per month; would buy two glasses of wine; and might purchase three or four lattes. Had the dues been increased by a bit each year since the last increase, it would have been only \$1 per year and would not have been felt at all. One of the results from the Zonta International Survey, that we as a club completed last year under Sheila Davis' guidance at one of our meetings, indicated that the "value of membership exceeds financial obligations." No one likes the fact that it costs more to live today than it did in 1995. It is, however, reality and we must cope with it. I hope we will all accept and understand the rationale for increasing the dues in spite of not liking the increase.

See you at our November 8 meeting, which is on Zonta's actual birthday. Come celebrate!
