President Linda's October Message...

The ideals of Zonta were in the air in Boulder during the 54th Annual District 12 Conference. What a fabulous opportunity to meet members from other clubs and find out how they advance the status of women through service, fundraising and increasing membership.

International Vice President Beryl Sten from Sweden is a delightful lady who attended the entire conference. She delivered our International President Mary Ellen Bittner's remarks via power point. The Presentation included all the areas Zonta International takes part in on our behalf. She gave us great detail on the international service projects:

Fighting trafficking of women in Bosnia-Herzegovina, working in Afghanistan to create the Afghan Institute of Learning and Health Care and education and vaccination against maternal and neonatal tetanus, and creating Mata Masu Dubara(Women on the Move) to fight the aids epidemic in Africa. Our international service projects are a great tool in recruiting new members to Zonta so is good for us to be able to list them easily when speaking to others about Zonta.

At the District level the news was fantastic. Evie Ashmore was elected treasurer for the 2006-2008 Biennium and Diane Twinning was elected Area 3 Vice Director!!!! Congratulations and thank you to these talented and tireless examples of professional, giving Denver Zontians.

The presentation of the Zontian of the Year is always exciting and this year's winner is a shining example. And was she surprised! It is a surprise to you too! Come to the meeting to see who it is.

The membership breakout presented

by Lt. Governor Bev Morrow painted a less inspiring picture. Membership has dropped from 33,320 in 2002 to 32,689 in 2005. District 12 had 719 members last years and the number is no at 643. The 1.8% decline internationally is overshadowed by the 10.5% decrease at the district level. Our club lost 5 of our 41 members for a 12.1% decline.

As a club we set a goal of increasing membership beyond 41. At the June dinner meeting we all nodded in agreement that each member would recruit 1 new member before January 31. This is a great time of year to recruit members for clubs. People are settling in for the rest of the year and looking at their personal goals. Those who feel very busy now through the holidays will commit to visiting once now and joining in January. The one missing ingredient is your invitation. And remember marketing experts say it takes at least 3 attempts to get your prospect to make a positive decision. So mention Zonta to your friends all the time. Let them know what fun you had at your last Zonta meeting or service project. Ask them to join all the time. And ask them to our Fall Shopping Spree Fundraiser October 7 and 8.

Zonta International wants us to increase our awareness of Stem Cell Research. It has a large impact on women, their bodies and their choices. Janell Will of the Douglas County club is a former member of our club and daughter of our member, Delores Lowrey. Janell put a very informative power point presentation regarding the facts of Stem Cell Research. Look for more information to come from International.

Zonta Club of Denver General Meeting Minutes September 8th

The meeting was called to order at 6:10 pm.

Julie Bradley described the Salvation Army's efforts to help the 350 Hurricane Katrina victims housed at Lowry, including food, clothing, rental housing and jobs. The original onemonth commitment has been extended to six months. Julie noted that 100% of donations to the Katrina relief fund go to programs. Julie Bradley provided the invocation.

Guests: Bonnie Seligson of the Tame Foundation attended as the guest of Beth Mundell.

Program: Diane Twining and Judy McNerny conducted the program on ways to attract and keep new members. Members brainstormed ideas and shared them with the group.

Minutes: August minutes were approved as printed in the Smoke Signal.

Treasurer: Judy Allen distributed the proposed budget. The Membership Committee has asked for money to recruit new members. Nikki Headlee made a motion that any member who goes to the District and/or Area Conference within a year of joining be reimbursed in full for registration fees. Sheila Davis seconded, and the motion carried. Judy Allen will amend the budget to reflect the additional expenses, and the budget was approved as amended.

Service: Beth Mundell distributed guidelines for reporting service hours. Qualified organizations are those that have been approved by the club, to which the club has given a grant, or which members serve as a group. In addition, members may apply to the Service Committee for approval of organizations that improve the status of women and children, in keeping with the club's mission. Requests for grant applications have been mailed. Beth distributed a list of recipients. Robin Forti reported the Imagination Library Committee has signed 80 children. The committee is trying to get a meeting and photo op with Dolly Parton when she's in town October 6th

Membership: Julie Bradley handed out Zonta business cards she made for each club member. She also distributed the new directories. Julie suggested that Christmas giving be aimed at the Teen Moms program in place of Adopt-a-Family. Hats and gloves are suggested for next month's general meeting, when we will celebrate Marjorie Pickett's 50th anniversary as a Zontian. The November meeting has been moved to Thursday the 3rd, as Margaret Fomer will be presented with an award on November 10th. Tickets for the award dinner are \$150 per person. Margaret's husband will subsidize 50% of the ticket price for club members. Julie and

Cathy Conley have more information.

Fundraising: Sheila Davis displayed items that will be for sale at the District 12 Conference and the Fall Shopping Spree. Mary Benoit had Zonta note cards available for sale at the meeting; they'll also be sold at District. Eighteen vendors have signed for the Fall Shopping Spree. Joetta Williams will take names of potential vendors, who may sign up until September 30th. Members are asked to contribute to the Make-or-Bake table, and to sign up for shifts at the event. Cynthia Herndon has sent out 400 invitations. Julie will send out e-mailable invitations, and each member received a packet of flyers to post locally. Signs and newsletter ads will go out closer to the event. The raffle license has been delayed due to a missing report from last year's raffle. The license should be in hand by the end of September for District. Raffle results will be announced at the Christmas Party.

President: President Linda Rhea reported that the club has received a Certificate of Recognition as an "inspiring face of international Colorado" from UNICEF. There will be a luncheon for honorees Monday, October 24th, United Nations Day. The Salvation Army has invited representatives from ZCD to a reception Tuesday, September 20th in recognition of support.

Old Business: Diane Twining displayed Zonta window decals, which are a joint project with the Zonta Foothills Club of Boulder. They will be sold on the District 12 and Zonta International websites. Any profits will go to the membership budget.

Announcements:

- * Mandy Ziegler read an excerpt for the book <u>I Told the Mountain to Move</u> by Patricia Raybon. The passage spoke highly of the Zonta Chapel at University Hospital.
- * Mary Benoit announced that Great Harvest Bread Company will open this Sunday, with all income going to Hurricane Katrina relief.
- Bell ringing for the Salvation Army is scheduled for Saturday, December 3rd.
- * The Santa Claus Shop will be December 14th through the 17th, with work sessions prior to those dates.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 9:00 pm.
