President Sheila's October Message...

As I look out the window of my homeoffice today, I see my lawn, which is so green and lush. I am amazed by what a summer with sufficient water can do! On lawn mowing days the grass is so long I can hardly find the poop to scoop before the lawn mowers come. (I live a very exciting life.) The water has done wonders for my roses too. They are gorgeous, with lots of blooms and thick green leaves. I haven't done a thing to them all summer except snip off the old blooms. No extra water, no fertilizer, no bug killer. It dawned on me that our club cannot be the same way however. If we don't take care of it even when things are going well, it won't continue to grow and be strong. We must always work on the areas of membership, service, and fundraising, or we will have a declining membership, no service projects, and very little money.

I've noticed this time of year everyone is so busy, and the holidays are fast approaching. Club members are feeling overwhelmed with job commitments, home life, other charitable efforts, and Zonta responsibilities, and yet we all want to take care of our club and its projects. I finally turned off the TV since I was so overwhelmed by the disparity of wealth and poverty just one channel away from each other. I decided to just do just one thing regarding this issue. I went online to look for Bill Clinton's website on curing world hunger so that I could make a small donation. I couldn't find it, but I found another website that mentioned a book written by George McGovern, Bob Dole, and Donald Messer. The title was Ending Hunger Now. I ordered a copy. I plan to read it, even if I can only read one page every now and then. I felt like I had done something, and I felt much better. My minister at church always reminds the congregation to "just take on an assignment no matter how small. That way you don't have to feel responsible for solving all of the world's problems." (Ask Nikki about her starfish story. It's along the same lines.)

VATIONAL BREAST CANCER AWARENESS MONTH

Key Stats

- 1. An estimated 211,240 new cases of invasive breast cancer, 58,490 new cases of breast cancer in situ (the cancer remains confined to the milk ducts) and 40,410 deaths from the disease occurred in 2005. Breast cancer is the most common site of cancer in women and the second-leading cause of cancer death in women.
- 2. The five-year relative survival rate for localized breast cancer has increased from 72 percent in the 1940s to 98 percent today. If the cancer has spread regionally, however, the rate is 81 percent, and for women with cancer that has spread to distant parts of the body, the rate is 26 percent.
- 3. Survival after a diagnosis of breast cancer continues to decline beyond five years. Ten-year survival and beyond is also stagedependent, with the best survival observed in women with early-stage disease.
- 4. Well-known estrogen-related risks for developing breast cancer include early menstruation (at age 12 or younger); late menopause (after age 55); and no full-term pregnancy or first child after age 30.
- 5. More than 80 percent of biopsied breast abnormalities are noncancerous, but any breast lump must be evaluated by a physi-

Zonta Club of Denver General Meeting Minutes September 14, 2006

The meeting was called to order at 6:03pm.

Invocation: Judy Allen read a passage from Sandra Stemmler's book.

Member Moment: Julie Bradley spoke about Carroll Allen.

Program: President Sheila Davis talked about attending the Zonta International Convention in Australia. District 12 was recognized, with 100% of clubs donating to Zonta International. ZCD is one of only a few clubs donating more than \$20,000 to International in the last biennium. Evie Ashmore was inducted as District 12 Treasurer. Sheila noted that ZI has restated its mission to include advocacy as well as service in advancing the status of women. She also described new and continuing service projects in Bolivia, Sri Lanka, Niger, and Afghanistan.

Minutes: August minutes were approved as printed in the Smoke Signal.

Treasurer: Judy Allen noted that the audit committee has finished its work.

Membership: Nikki Headlee reported a total of 36 members, including new inductees Robin Smith and Amanda Megill. An open house for prospective members will be held Thursday, September 21st, at the King penthouse. Judy McNerny, Evie Ashmore, and Cathy Conley have created a Zonta fact sheet for prospective members. The committee has decided to reinstate the mentor program for new members; each will have a mentor in addition to a sponsor.

Service/Status of Women: Robin Forti noted that letters from several of last year's grant recipients were printed in the Smoke Signal. Copies of the two books the club sponsored at Recording for the Blind and Dyslexic and the recorded CDs have been added to the library. Several events are being planned for the DKI Teen Moms, including a cooking class, Christmas gifts, and a graduation party. Over 400 service hours have been recorded toward the goal of 2,000 hours for the year. The Imagination Library will be promoted at District with flyers for friends and family subscriptions, a change bank for donations, and the sale of Women's Bean Project products as a fundraiser.

Fundraising: Judy Allen reported for the Fundraising Committee. She will pick up more Macy's tickets and mail them to members. The committee is working on the raffle license, and plans to have it in time to sell tickets at District. Three theater events are planned for the year, with shows and dates to be announced. The non-event fundraiser is scheduled for spring.

Public Relations: Julie Bradley distributed the new club directories. She is taking requests from those who wish to have Zonta business cards. Anyone who has not registered on the ZI website is requested to do so.

New Business: Nikki Headlee introduced new members for induction Amanda Megill and Robin Smith and their sponsors. Nikki read the objects of Zonta International. Judy McNerny, assisted by Judy Allen, recounted the story of the Zonta emblem.

Sheila Davis thanked Linda Rhea for putting together a CD of pictures from the convention in Australia, and gave her a yellow rose pin. The slide show will be available at the October meeting.

- The open house at the King penthouse will be Thursday, September 21st.
- District 12 meets September 29th to October 1st in Fort Collins.

- The Macy's fundraising event is Tuesday, October 10th.
- Sugar Plum Fair is scheduled for Saturday, October 28th at the Boulder Country Club.
- The Amelia Earhart dinner is Sunday, January 28th, and will be hosted by the Foothills Club of Boulder County.

Dorothy Swindt won the door prize.
