August 28, 2007

We're off to a great start this year (yikes, we're one-fourth of the way through that year!) and have already added one new member. That member is Mindy Craig. She's special because she's the niece of our Judy McNerny. It's truly wonderful to see Zonta passed from one generation to another. "Do We Have As Much Sense As A Goose?"

Leadership is the ability to work with and motivate others to achieve goals. We offer the following story:

Next Spring, should you see geese heading back north for the summer flying along a "V" formation, you might be interested in Knowing what scientist have discovered about why they fly that way. It has been learned that as each bird flaps its wings, it creates an uplift for the bird immediately following.

By flying in a "V" formation, the whole flock adds at least 71% greater flying range that if each bird flew on its own. **Basic Truth**: People who share a common direction and sense of community can get where they are going quicker and easier because they are traveling on the thrust of one another.

Whenever a goose falls out of formation, it suddenly feels the drag and resistance of trying to go it alone and quickly gets back into formation to take advantage of the lifting power of the bird immediately in front. **Basic Truth**: If we have as much sense as a goose, we will stay in formation with those who are headed the same way we are going.

When the lead goose gets tired, she rotates back in the wing and another goose flies point. **Basic Truth:** It pays to take turns doing hard jobs.

The geese hank from behind to encourage those up front to keep up their speed. **Basic Truth:** We need to be careful what we say when we honk from behind.

Finally, when a goose is sick and falls out, two geese fall out of formation and follow her down to help and protect her. They stay with her until she is either able to fly or until she is dead, and then they launch out on their own or with another formation to catch up with their group. **Final Truth:** If we have the sense of a goose, we will stand by each other.

He pre-measured his truck's weight and then brought his new Missus over in the truck and on to the scale. She was smart though...she knew what he did and Minnie remembers her step mom declaring with all of her "southern charm", that her new husband "would have many friends circling him saying 'doesn't he look natural lying there? (...in his casket!)" Yes, she had a delightful sense of humor.

Minnie married Mr. Lundberg and sadly, he left this world all too soon, but the sweetness Ms. Minnie had in her voice when she spoke of "Mr. Lundberg" was truly endearing. It was through Mr. Lundberg that Minnie met Kendall King. Mr. King was very interested in having Minnie work for the King Foundation, and after significant salary negotiation, she has spent the past many years working for the foundation. Her contributions have been a shining example to many professional women, and no place more than in the Zonta Club of Denver. Minnie will be retiring in May 2008. Concerning her retirement, it sounds as though the King Foundation still does not believe that she is really going through with it... denial (not the River)....but she is going to retire...there is traveling to do!
