ODDS AND ENDS

ZONTIANS IN THE KITCHEN

Mary Benoit's Frog Eye Salad

1 c. sugar	2-20 oz. cans fruit cocktail
2 Tbsp flour	
2 ½ tsp salt	2-20 oz. cans crushed pineapple, drained
1 ¾ c. pineapple juice*	13½ oz. non-dairy whipped topping or 2 c. heavy cream, whipped
2 eggs, beaten	
1 Tbsp lemon juice	1 c. miniature marshmallows (optional)
3 qts water	1 c. coconut (optional)
1 Tbsp salad oil	
16 oz. Acini de Pepe (or Soup-Macs)	
3-11 oz. cans mandarin oranges	

Combine sugar, flour and one-half teaspoon of the salt. Gradually stir in pineapple juice and eggs. Cook over moderate heat, stirring until thickened. Add lemon juice. Cool to room temp. Bring water, remaining salt and oil to boil. Add Acini de Pepe and cook at rolling boil until done. Drain, rinse, drain again, and cool. Combine egg mixture and Acini de Pepe; mix lightly but thoroughly. Refrigerate until chilled in airtight container. Makes 25 servings.

* Use juice drained from fruit. Refrigerate fruit overnight after draining.

WOMEN'S ISSUES IN THE NEWS

Nicholas Kristof's July 29 *New York Times* column highlights the lack of attention paid globally to maternal health. "If men had uteruses, 'paternity wards' would get resources, ambulances would transport pregnant men to hospitals free of charge, deliveries would be free, and the Group of 8 industrialized nations would make

paternal mortality a top priority," he says.

However, on his blog post of the same day Kristof also reports that The U.N. Population Fund is beginning to pay attention to maternal health and not just to family planning. For example, "fistula has gained more attention."

Kristof states that "during World War I, more American women died in childbirth than American men died in war. Then, after women's suffrage became a reality, maternal mortality fell sharply. It seems that when women were accepted fully into the political system, then resources were also made available in the health system."
