Jane M. Klausman Scholarship Winner Honored at September Meeting

Edit Maszlaver of Denver, Colorado is the recipient of the 2015 Zonta Club of Denver Jane M. Klausman Women in Business Scholarship. In addition, we are proud to announce that Edit was also the winner of the District 12 scholarship. Edit will attend the September Zonta meeting to receive her award.

Edit was chosen as a Jane M. Klausman Women in Business Scholarship recipient because of her outstanding academic achievement. She intends to pursue a Master's Degree in Professional Accountancy, emplasizing international taxation from Metropolitan State University of Denver and to then start working on a Certified Public



Accountant designation. Edit believes that businesses often need to expand globally to stay competitive. She would like to be the person who can help companies grow their businesses internationally.

Edit was born in Hungary and has a younger sister. Edit felt she had to grow up fast when her father died when she was just 15. Edit's mother had a degree in accounting, and from the start, she knew she wanted a college degree. At the time Edit was of the age to start college, Hungary was just coming out of the socialistic era, and women were often encouraged to stick to traditional jobs like hair styling. However, Edit wanted to follow in her mother's footsteps in accounting.

Edit completed one year of college in Hungary, but then stopped going to school after becoming pregnant and getting married. Edit's husband was an architect whose dream was to come to the United States, so her family came here in 1997, where she had a baby boy. They had another baby, a little girl, and decided to settle in Denver.

At first Edit was a stay at home mom, but then the marriage took a turn for the worse, and she had to move out and find full time employment to support herself and her children. She found a job as a bookkeeper and office manager. Because it was a growing company, she found herself having to work 12 hour days. Edit was divorced in 2006 and became a single mom with 2 children.

In 2009 Edit decided to start again to work towards her goal of attaining her college degree by enrolling at Metropolitan State University. She was one of our Metro scholarship winners in 2011. She worked full-time during the 5 years it took to receive her B.S. in Business Management and an International Business Certificate in May of 2014. Edit decided to continue her education and this December she will have earned a Masters of Professional Accountancy degree.

Edit's 18-year-old son has just graduated from high school and is joining the Marines this September. Edit's 17-year-old daughter is a senior in high school and wants to eventually pursue a degree in International Relations.

Edit is now in the running for a JMK scholarship at the Zonta International level. She is a very deserving winner, and we wish Edit the best.

Update: Voices Against Violence

The World Association of Girl Guides and Girl Scouts (WAGGGS), in partnership with

UN Women and with the support of Zonta International, is working to prevent and reduce gender discrimination and violence against women and girls through non-formal education and youth leadership engagement.

The Voices against Violence curriculum teaches young people, ages 5-25, to understand gender-based violence and its root causes, identify various forms of violence prevalent globally and in their communities, and explore solutions. The curriculum will be delivered by training 200 national trainers from as many as 30 countries at four regional workshops funded by Zonta International.

These trainers will then return to their home countries and train at least 3,000 additional youth leaders and educators. The program is expected to reach an estimated 800,000 children and young people by the end of the project cycle in 2016.



Advocacy Committee

We had an impromptu meeting after the August club meeting to discuss the details of funding Zonta Wings.

For those who don't know, or can't remember, what Zonta Wings is here is the scoop.



Zonta Wings was a project started by the Zonta Club of the Pikes Peak Area in connection with the Human Trafficking Task Force of Southern Colorado. (That Task Force was started by past District 12 Governor Betty Edwards, a member of the Pikes Peak club.) One gap in services to victims is that of transportation. Often a rescued victim is in danger of being re-recruited through physical and/or emotional coercion if she remains in the local community. But perhaps the victim has a cousin in New Jersey willing to help her. Neither federal agencies (the FBI) nor local authorities (human services, police) have funding available to move victims. Zonta Wings would help to fill that gap by paying for emergency transportation. Zonta Wings funds could be used to purchase a bus or plane ticket to get this victim from possible danger in Colorado to family in New Jersey.

Last year, our club voted to allocate \$500 from club service funds for the same purpose, through the Colorado Network to End Human Trafficking (CoNEHT), a statewide network of agencies dedicated to assisting victims of human trafficking. Alexis Newton, a member of our committee, works with CoNEHT, and thought the best way to get our money to CoNEHT was through a prepaid credit card. We did some research and found that King Soopers offers a prepaid card with minimal fees. Mary Benoit and Alexis will be working together to get the card, activate it, and deliver it to CoNEHT through Dr. A.J. Steele at the Laboratory to Combat Human Trafficking, a member of CoNEHT. We expect to receive reports about use of this money which we will pass on to you.

We also hope that the Service Committee will allocate a similar amount to Zonta Wings in this year's service budget and that club members will approve that allocation.

The Committee's next focus will be planning a project for the 16 Days of Activism against Gender-Based Violence. The 16 Days campaign uses the sixteen days between International Day for the Elimination of Violence Against Women (November 25) and International Human Rights Day (December 10) to reinforce that eliminating all forms of violence against women is a human rights issue and that the act of perpetrating violence against women is a human rights violation.
